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Students at the University of Northern Colorado during Summer term, 1976, will have a variety of course-offering choices. Along with many workshops and special interest courses, students will have the option to select the courses from a variety of sessions. Included in the Summer, 1976, session are sessions one week in length, two weeks in length, eight weeks in length and ten weeks in length to allow students to select courses based upon their own particular needs. All courses are identified in the Schedule of Classes with beginning and ending dates. It is sincerely hoped that this experiment will better meet the needs of the UNC summer student.

THE UNIVERSITY

Established in 1889 as a state normal school and in 1935 as the Colorado State College of Education, the University of Northern Colorado was granted university status in May, 1970 in recognition of the institution's extensive graduate and undergraduate programs. Committed to excellence in education, the university is a member of and accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

The 243-acre University Campus is divided into three main campuses; the East campus with housing and Jackson athletic field; the Central campus which includes class and administration buildings and faculty housing; and the new Darrell Holmes campus which contains the James A. Michener Library and other class buildings and dormitories. Facilities on the campus include a laboratory school, placement service, an off-campus instruction program, an educational resources building center, an instructional materials center, KUNC-FM radio station, bureaus of research, health and counseling services, an alumni association, the Butler-Hancock Hall, the new Health, Physical Education and Recreation building.

Special workshops, travel-study tours and outstanding faculty, administration and nationally-known speakers and artists all help to enrich the regular academic program.

LABORATORY SCHOOL

Many educational opportunities are available for youngsters. Morning classes are planned by the Laboratory School (kindergarten and grades one through six), the Special Education School and nursery school are conducted by the Home Economics Department. Summer sessions are planned for grades two through twelve by Greeley School District Six. More information on these programs may be obtained through the individual schools or the school district offices.

GREELEY

Greeley is a growing city of 57,000 and the county seat of agricultural Weld County. Greeley is located 30 miles east of the picturesque Rocky Mountain Range and 52 miles north of Denver, the state capital. Founded in 1870 by Horace Greeley and originally known as the Union Colony, Greeley still boasts wide, tree-lined streets and avenues, numbered for easy reference.

Greeley's cultural and recreational opportunities include a community college, a city recreation program, 12 parks, 3 golf courses, 2 historical museums, 2 public libraries, and the Greeley Philharmonic Society, the oldest symphony orchestra west of the Mississippi River. There is also the new Greeley Mall, a modern, fully-carpeted shopping center south of town containing a variety of shops and restaurants; and several other shopping areas.

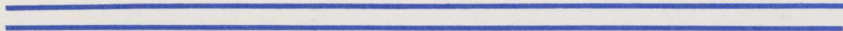


UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS

B.A., B.S. and B.M.

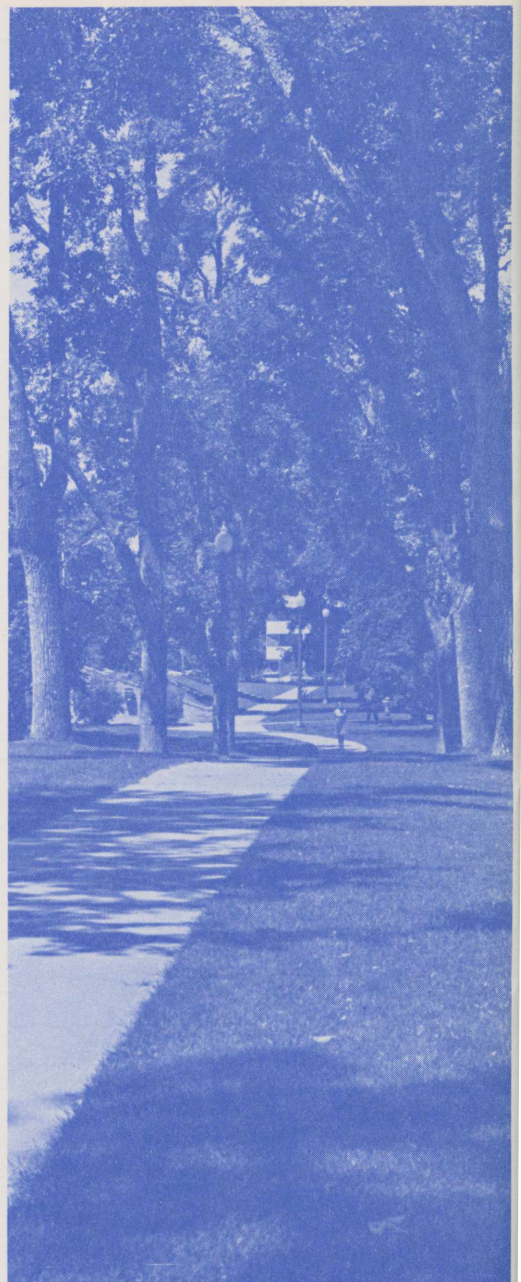
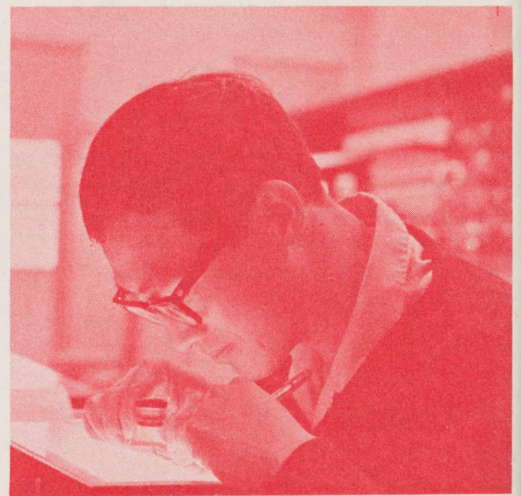


Majors are offered in the teaching profession by numerous academic departments. Students studying for teacher certification must apply for admission to the Professional Teacher Education Program prior to their junior year. Courses applicable to pre-law, pre-medicine, pre-dentistry, and pre-engineering are designed for students who want to begin their studies at UNC.

Since the university operates on a four-quarter basis, all programs of study are available to the summer student. The four-quarter plan helps a student complete his or her undergraduate requirements for graduation in three years, if he or she elects a program of continuous study.

POLICY

Students applying for admission to the University of Northern Colorado for Summer Quarter should complete and return the form on page 60. Additional information required as part of application for admission depends upon the status of the students as defined below. Inquiries concerning the graduate program or graduate admissions should be directed to the Dean of the Graduate School. Undergraduates should contact the Director of Admissions for application forms. The application for the baccalaureate and master's degrees and the graduate student certification program must be accompanied by a \$10.00 transcript evaluation fee.

GRADUATE STUDENTS

The University requires that the Graduate Record Examination Aptitude Test scores accompany the doctoral application. If a student's score is below the minimum acceptable score in the Aptitude Test, he will be denied admission to the doctoral program. Students seeking a graduate degree from the University of Northern Colorado may transfer eight quarter hours toward a master's or Specialist in Education degree and 12 quarter hours toward a Doctoral degree. If the work is acceptable to all members of the Oral Comprehensive Examination Committee, a doctoral student may transfer an additional 23 quarter hours of work.

TRANSFER STUDENTS

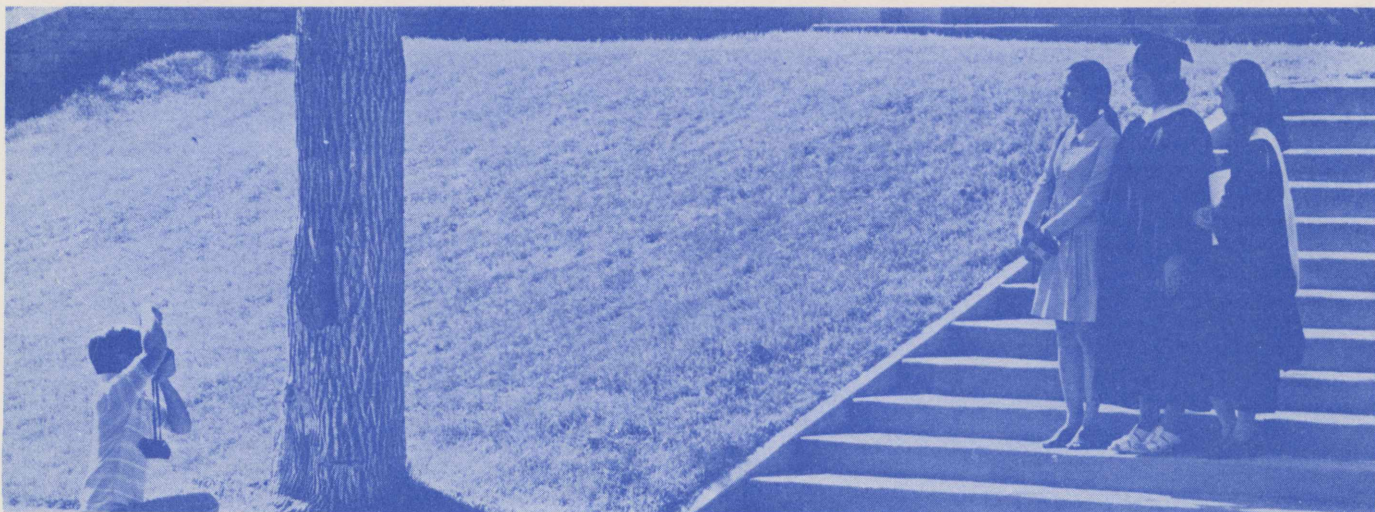
The University accepts a maximum of 135 quarter hours of transfer credits on undergraduate programs. Credits earned at a junior or community college after completion of the sophomore year, or beyond 96 quarter hours will not be transferable. All degree-seeking students must submit an official Application for Admission, a transcript of high school studies, two transcripts of previous college work and a health report. Application forms may be obtained by writing to the Director of Admissions.

FRESHMEN

Students who are entering college for the first time should write to the Director of Admissions for information and application forms. To be eligible to apply for admission, students must graduate in the upper one-half of their class or have scores on the American College Test which are at or above national averages. Other minimal admission standards are defined in the Undergraduate catalog.

SPECIAL STUDENTS

An undergraduate student planning to attend the University of Northern Colorado for the Summer Quarter **only** must return the appropriate forms on page 60 and 61. Attendance for the summer quarter does not assure admission for subsequent quarters. Official application for admission must be made if the student plans to continue his degree program at the University of Northern Colorado.



GRADUATE PROGRAMS



The Graduate School offers nine advanced degree programs leading to the Master of Arts (M.A.), Master of Music (M.M.), Master of Music Education (M.M.E.), Master of Science (M.S.), Specialist in Education (Ed.S.), Doctor of Arts (D.A.), Doctor of Education (Ed.D.), Doctor of Music Education (D.M.E.), and Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.).

Detailed information concerning advanced degrees may be obtained by consulting the 1976-77 Graduate School Catalog or by writing Dr. A.R. Reynolds, Dean of the Graduate School, UNC 80639.

Course Load and Credit. The normal load for graduate credit applicable to a degree is fifteen hours per quarter. Overloads (16 to 19 quarter hours) must be approved by the Dean of the Graduate School. Under no circumstances may a student count in a degree program more than 19 hours of course work in a fall, winter, spring, or summer quarter; more than 15 hours in an eight weeks summer quarter; or more than 9 hours in a five week enrollment.

MASTER'S DEGREE

The Master's degree may be earned in three summer quarters of full-time study. The master's degree is awarded upon completion of a minimum of 45 quarter hours of credit. Candidates must be on campus enrolled as full-time students for two quarters (*at least ten weeks and complete ten quarter hours per quarter; eight weeks attendance and complete ten quarter hours during the summer quarter*) to satisfy the minimum residence requirements.

The master's degree is offered by the following departments or disciplines: Anthropology¹; Biological Science; Botany; Business; Chemistry; Communication; Curriculum and Instruction; Earth Science; Economics¹; Educational Administration; Educational Media; Elementary Education; English; Fine Arts; Foreign Languages; Geography¹; Gerontology; Health, Physical Education and Recreation; History; Home Economics; Industrial Arts; Mathematics; Music; Physics; Political Science¹; Psychology, Counseling and Guidance; Reading; Research and Statistical Methodology; Science Education; Social Science; Sociology¹; Special Education; Theatre Arts; and Zoology.

SPECIALIST IN EDUCATION

The Specialist in Education degree is a one-year program beyond the master's degree, assuming that the area of specialization is compatible with the undergraduate and master's major.

¹The departments of Anthropology, Economics, Geography, Political Science, and Sociology offer a Master of Arts degree in Social Science. The student may concentrate on the discipline of his choice.



DOCTOR OF ARTS

A two-year program beyond the master's degree, the Doctor of Arts degree is designed to prepare a student for a lifetime of creative teaching at the junior (community) or senior college level together with a supplementary commitment to research. The Doctor of Arts is offered in the following disciplines: Biological Sciences; Chemistry; Geography; History; Mathematics; and Music. All candidates are required to spend three consecutive quarters in residence in full-time study (*at least ten weeks and complete ten quarter hours per quarter; eight weeks attendance and complete ten quarter hours during the summer quarter*). The University operates four full quarters per year (Fall, Winter, Spring, Summer). A student must earn a minimum of 72 quarter hours of credit and pass comprehensive examinations. In addition, he must write and defend an acceptable dissertation.

DOCTOR OF EDUCATION

A two-year program beyond the master's degree, the Doctor of Education degree requires course work and research of a professional nature. All candidates are required to spend three consecutive quarters in residence in full-time study (*at least ten weeks and complete ten quarter hours per quarter; eight weeks attendance and complete ten quarter hours during the summer quarter*). The University operates four full quarters per year (Fall, Winter, Spring, Summer). A student must earn a minimum of 72 quarter hours of credit and pass comprehensive examinations. In addition, he must write and defend an acceptable dissertation.

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY

A two-year program beyond the master's degree or a three-year program beyond the baccalaureate degree, the Doctor of Philosophy degree requires course work and research to prepare graduate students for creative and meaningful teaching at the college level in one of the following areas: College Student Personnel Administration; and Research and Statistical Methodology.



FINANCIAL INFORMATION

TUITION AND FEES

All rates quoted are those estimated for Summer Quarter 1976 and are subject to a provision that the University reserves the right to change tuition, fees and other charges without notice. As with all state-supported institutions, the rates are affected by legislative action which may not be finalized until late spring of any given year. The State of Colorado is considering a uniform hourly tuition assessment policy which, if put into practice in the Summer of 1976, might result in a per credit hour tuition charge which would differ from the estimated amount shown below.

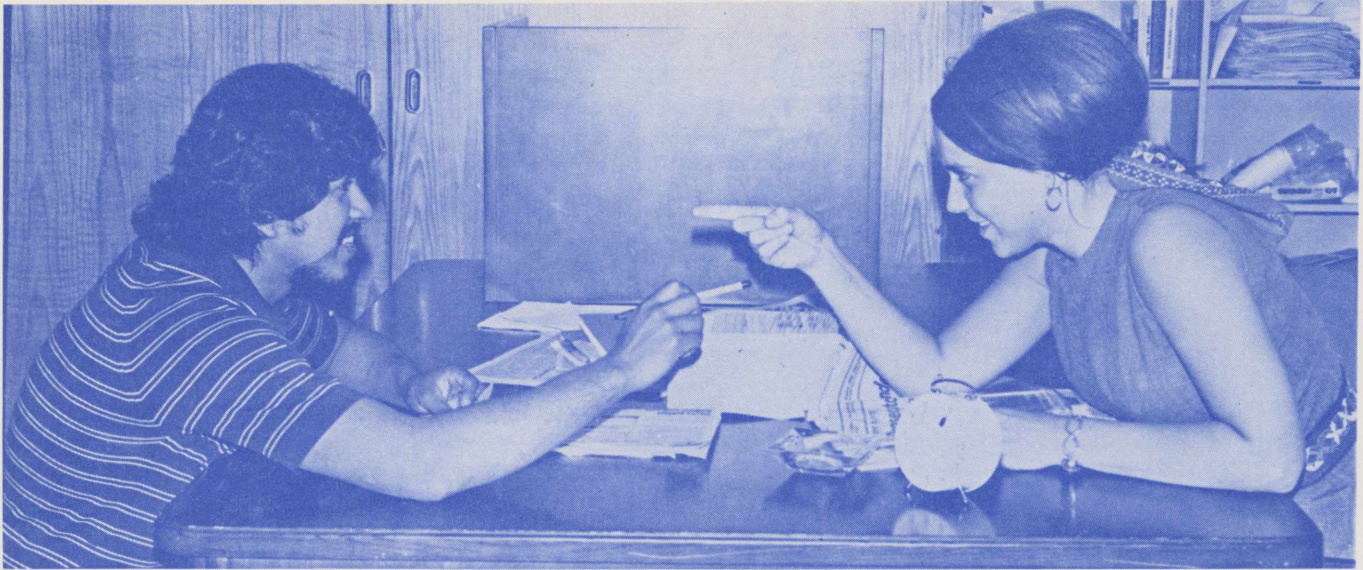

(If a student was not enrolled full-time--for more than six credit hours--Spring Quarter 1976, he does not have health insurance coverage for the Summer Quarter of 1976. This insurance can be obtained only by requesting coverage at registration or at the Student Health Center during the first week of the quarter.)

Tuition and Student Services Fees are incurred during each quarterly registration period and are due and payable at the time shown on the billing which is mailed to the student each quarter. Charges are assessed for the total of partial or full programs whether taken for credit or non credit.

ADDITIONAL FEES

Special Program Fees such as bowling, field trips, golf, etc. are billed at cost. Extra charges are incurred for programs leading to the Specialist in Education and Doctoral degrees. Consult the 1976-77 Undergraduate or Graduate School Catalog for all itemizations of extra fees and assessments. No graduate phasing fees will be altered or refunded if a registrant fails to pursue his program or for any reason drops out of the course of study into which he has been accepted.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Nearly all scholarships or waivers of tuition issued apply only to the fall, winter and spring quarters. Holders of special scholarships having questions about their prospective awards should inquire about their status to the respective departments authorized to confirm their award or to the Office of Financial Aids.

RESIDENT, NON-RESIDENT STATUS

Determination of status as in-state or out-of-state for tuition purposes is fixed at registration. Colorado Revised Statutes 1966 as amended in 1973, fix state regulations which apply at all state institutions of higher education in Colorado. If a person wishes to have his classification changed from out-of-state to in-state for tuition purposes, he must petition for such a change through the Registrar's Office prior to Registration.

REFUND POLICY

To be eligible for a refund of any kind, the student must present a formal, approved Notice of Withdrawal or an Add-Drop Slip at the Accounting Office. Forms may be obtained from the Records Office.

Partial refunds for full-quarter classes are granted only for early withdrawals. No refunds will be granted for special, short-period classes after the first meeting of the class. Please consult the 1976-77 Undergraduate or Graduate School Catalog for the specific refund policies of the University.

HOUSING

SINGLE

University housing is available in residence halls for single men and women. All accommodations in the residence halls include room and board. The rooms are arranged to accommodate two persons per room.

Room and Board: \$352.00 per person for the 8-week summer quarter.

FAMILY

The University offers family housing in two residence halls containing housekeeping facilities for married students with one or two children or for couples without children.

Furnished suites with Kitchenette: Turner Hall, \$320.00 and Lawrenson Hall, \$368.00, per family for the 8-week summer quarter.

Cafeteria meal service is available on an optional basis.

***Rates quoted above are subject to a provision of the Trustees that the university reserves the right to change rates prior to the beginning of any academic quarter.**

OFF-CAMPUS

Many students find rooms, apartments and houses in the Greeley area. Room and apartment listings are available to any student who desires to contact the Department of University Housing. Arrangements for accommodations with private householders cannot be made by the Department of University Housing, but must be conducted by the student directly with the landlord. Students and landlords are both advised to have a clear understanding, preferably in writing, as to facilities, privileges, prices and intended length of tenancy.

APPLICATION FOR CAMPUS HOUSING

Address correspondence to the Department of University Housing, Gordon Hall, University of Northern Colorado, Greeley, Colorado 80639.

If after applying, the student desires to cancel his application for either single or family housing in the residence halls for Summer Quarter, he should notify the Director of Housing, in writing. The following policy will apply:

Cancellations for Summer Quarter received before May 15, 1976, \$25 will be refunded. **There are no refunds for applications made and then cancelled after May 16, 1976.**



REGISTRATION

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

Proper registration is the responsibility of each student. No person may register for another student. The University does not have facilities for registering "In Absentia" or at times other than those designated in these instructions. Students should read the catalog and know course requirements.

Registration for 10 week classes ONLY is scheduled for Monday, June 14. Registration for one week classes and workshops beginning during the week of June 14 will be held in the assigned classrooms.

Registration for 8 week sessions and workshops beginning on or after June 21 is scheduled for Monday, June 21. Students attending workshops beginning on or after June 21 and 8 week classes should register for their entire summer program on June 21. Students attending workshops only may register in person at the first class session in the assigned classroom.

Ten week classes begin June 14. Eight week classes begin June 22. No registration for ten week classes will be permitted after 3:00 p.m. on June 18. No registration for eight week classes will be permitted after 3:00 p.m. on June 25.

CONTACT ADVISER

After obtaining your supplies, contact your adviser in his office (except undergraduate majors in Anthropology, Business, Economics, Elementary Education, Fine Arts, Geography, History, Home Economics, Psychology (Graduate majors in PCG require a signature), Sociology and Special Education and Graduate Majors in College Student Personnel Work and Special Education). If you do not know who your adviser is, please go to the departmental office of your major. All cards must be completed and the Emergency Locator-Second Preference Card must be signed by your adviser before you will be permitted to register. Second Preference courses should be approved Alternate Courses (not sections).

Unclassified Graduate Students and those not following a degree program will report to Student Council Room, University Center, at Registration. None of the work taken by a graduate student who is enrolled in an unclassified status may be counted in meeting the minimum residence requirements.

WORKSHOPS

Registration for one week classes and workshops beginning during the week of June 14 will be held in the assigned classrooms. Registration for workshops beginning on or after June 21 may be completed at Registration on June 21 or at the assigned classroom on the first day of the particular workshop offered. Students must register in person at the first class session, if they are not already registered. It is the student's responsibility to learn when his first class meets. Withdrawals from workshops must be made before the workshop is half over.

A student may register for a class for no credit by paying appropriate tuition and fees. No audit or visitors cards are issued--only "no credit" cards.

Report to the appropriate department stations in the Ballroom, University Center, to pick up the class cards. If you have a schedule conflict, a faculty member "trouble shooter" will be available to assist you. If a course is closed for which you are registering, the Second Preference Courses Schedule will be used to make up a complete schedule. Undergraduate students may not enroll for 600-700 level courses. Juniors and Seniors may enroll in 500 level courses with permission. All courses for which you are registering must show on the Emergency Locator Card and be initialed by the authorized departmental representative. This is your official study program. Proceed to the checking stations to leave your packet.

FEE PAYMENT

Veterans on G.I. Bill should report to the Veteran's Administration Office. Students with Financial Aid (Vocational Rehabilitation and all scholarships and grants) report to Office of Financial Aid, Carter Hall, during the week of Registration. Students will be billed for fees and tuition on or about July 2, 1976, at rates per credit hour as approved at that time and according to their current resident status. Students must present all copies of the Bill to the Accounting Office according to their scheduled day as shown on the Bill. Payment of the amount due should be made on this day.

A late fee of \$5.00 the first day and \$2.00 for each additional day will be charged.

Students registering for 10 week courses after June 14 or for 8 week courses after June 21 will be assessed a late registration fee at the rate of \$5.00 the first day and \$2.00 each additional day. (See Calendar on page 11 for last day of Registration.)

WITHDRAWAL POLICY

The last day to withdraw from a course is the mid-point of the course. The last date to withdraw from 8 and 10 week courses is July 20, at 12:00 noon. The last date to withdraw from other courses will be 3:00 p.m. of the mid-point day (count class days only) of the course.

TRANSCRIPTS

Transcripts for Summer quarter will be available upon request two weeks after the close of the quarter. Transcripts for the Summer Post Session will be available upon request two weeks after the close of the session.

GRADUATION

At 10:00 a.m., Saturday, August 14, in the Garden Theatre. Students are encouraged to attend graduation. Those who choose not to participate must notify the Office of the Registrar (Graduate School for graduate students) at least two weeks (July 30) prior to graduation so that appropriate addresses can be confirmed and graduation details can be clarified with Colleges, Schools and Departments. Students who participate in graduation are required to wear appropriate academic costume. Caps and gowns may be rented from the University Bookstore. No applications for graduation will be accepted after June 25, 1976.

SUMMER POST SESSION REGISTRATION

Registration for Summer Post Session courses will be conducted in the assigned classroom during the first meeting. Students must register in person at the first meeting. Withdrawals from these courses must be made before 3:00 p.m. of the mid-point day (count class days only) of the course.

On April 27, 1972, the faculty of the University of Northern Colorado adopted a calendar that eliminated the 3-day final examination schedule. Final examinations will not be specifically scheduled but are to be given at the discretion of the faculty member in accordance with the policy established by the school/college in which the faculty member is assigned. However, classes are expected to meet on all scheduled periods, to include the last day a class is scheduled, in the quarter.

SPECIAL EVENTS

Each summer the School of Music presents a full and varied program of concerts, recitals and musical theatre. This summer will be no exception. For the 45th consecutive year, the Summer Symphonic Band will present weekly concerts under the stars in the Garden Theatre.

In honor of the centennial/bicentennial the Summer Choir and Summer Symphony Orchestra along with faculty soloists will combine for a festival of American music.

SUMMER 1975 PRODUCTION

MEXICO - GUATEMALA

Travel-study course designed to survey as many of the major ecological communities of Mexico and Guatemala, natural and human, as can be encountered in 10 weeks. The most effective way to achieve this goal is to immerse ourselves in the environment which we are studying. Travel will be by car, over the 7,000 mile route, camping wherever possible. All participants will be expected to contribute their efforts to the daily tasks of setting camp, cooking, cleaning, packing, etc.

Emphasis will be on field examination of the major ecosystems of Mexico and Guatemala. Biological communities from deserts to rainforests, from 17,000 ft. mountains to barrier reefs will be encountered. Human ecology of both modern and primitive cultures will be stressed. Modern cultures of Mexico City and Guatemala City, ancient ruins of Toltec-Aztec and Mayan cultures and the Indians of the Guatemalan highlands will be visited.

EED 401-7 Workshop in the Teaching of English: Grammar

2 hours credit June 21 - July 2

EED 401-37 Workshop in the Teaching of English: The Contemporary Junior Novels (Literature for Adolescents)

(Class meets 1:25 - 3:20, MTWTh)

Students will read and discuss the special genre of literature written for adolescents. Emphasis will be placed on methods of teaching the junior novel.

MATHEMATICS

Mathematics Teachers' Workshop: Metrication

MED 577-7, June 21 - July 2, 3 hours credit

(Class meets 1:40 - 4:40 MTWThF)

(S-U Grading)

A workshop designed to provide the teacher with the essentials of the International System of units. The philosophical approach is: THINK METRIC. Topics will focus on the measurement of length, area, capacity (volume), mass, and temperature. Emphasis will be placed on relating the content of this workshop to mathematics and to the classroom. For elementary, middle school, and high school teachers.

Mathematics Teachers' Workshop: Teaching Mathematics with the Geoboard

MED 577-27, July 5 - July 16, 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 1:40 - 4:40 MTWThF)

(S-U Grading)

The emphasis in this course is the manipulation of geoboards, both rectangular and circular, to teach topics in elementary, middle school and senior high mathematics. Topics that are taught include numeration (both decimal and nondecimal), whole number, rational number and irrational number algorithms, fractional number development, number theory, simple transformational geometry as well as synthetic geometry, area, and finite systems. Discovery techniques are used throughout the course. The primary thrust of the course is the use of the geoboard in the teaching of mathematics.

Mathematics Teachers' Workshop: Instructional Materials

MED 577-37, July 19 - July 30, 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 1:40 - 4:40 MTWThF)

(S-U Grading)

A workshop designed to expose the mathematics teacher to materials and sources of materials which can be used for instructional purposes. Topics covered include aesthetic values of mathematics, instructional models, historical materials, classroom equipment, recreational materials, and calculating devices. For junior high and senior high teachers.

Mathematics Teachers Workshop: Learning Disabilities and Mathematics

MED 577-2, June 14 - 18, 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 8:20 - 11:20 a.m. and 12:20 - 3:20 p.m. MTWThF in Ross 300)

The principal resource person for this course will be Dr. Carole Greenes, Boston University, and will focus on the characteristics of the learning-disabled child and ways to differentiate these children from low achievers and the emotionally disturbed, the relevant mathematics content for learning-disabled children, and examples and strategies for teaching the learning-disabled child.

SCIENCES

BIO 480 Topics in Field Biology - Algae
2 hours credit, class meets 1:40 - 4:30 MTWThF.
July 5-16

A concentrated study of the freshwater algae found in the region. Considerable time will be spent in the field with an emphasis on the collection and identification of algae. There will be two overnight field trips. Students should have had at least 1 year of biology including an introductory botany course.

BIO 480 Topics in Field Biology - Fungi

There will be two overnight field trips. Students should have had at least 1 year of biology including an introductory botany course.

BIO 480 Topics in Field Biology - Bryophytes
1 hours credit, class meets 1:40 - 4:30 MTWThF.

A concentrated study of the mosses and liverworts found in the region. Considerable time will be spent in the field with time for collecting, identifying and photographing the bryophytes. There will be an overnight field trip. Students should have had at least 1 year of biology including an introductory botany course.

BIO 480 Topics in Field Biology - Rocky Mountain National Park and Pawnee National Grasslands
6 hours credit, class meets 8:20 to 5:30 on campus, 8 days will be spent in the field.
June 21 - July 2

This workshop is designed to increase the understanding and awareness of the unique biological features of two of our national preserves, Rocky Mountain National Park and Pawnee National Grasslands. The first two days will be spent on the UNC campus for field orientation and preparation for the field work. Three days will be spent in the field on the grasslands and five days will be spent in the mountains. The UNC mountain campus will be used during the 5 days spent in the mountains. The students will have an opportunity for a concentrated study of the plants, animals and their interactions and the impact of human populations on these natural communities. The topics explored will depend on the interest and abilities of the students. Approximately \$65 will be charged to cover cost of food, field facilities and transportation in the field. Enrollment is limited.

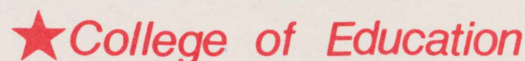

BIO 480 Topics in Field Biology - Ecosystems of Colorado - 5 hours credit.
Corequisite, to be taken concurrently with Earth Science 484-Earth Science Field Experience - Geology of Colorado - 5 hours credit.
July 19 - August 13

This field course and its corequisite, ESCS 484, are designed to provide an indepth understanding of the interrelationships between ecosystems in Colorado and the geological environments in which they occur. Ecological and geological features of Colorado will be investigated under the guidance of an ecologist and geologist. The class will meet in all day sessions on campus for the first week of the class. The following three weeks will be spent on a field trip in Western Colorado. A study of medical involvements, terminology, self-help skills and ancillary personnel for the severely physically disabled and other health impaired (OHI) will be discussed. Problems associated with self-concept, prosthetic and orthotic devices, transportation and environmental adaptations will be studied.

EDSE 540-001 Low Functioning Visually Impaired.

July 6 - July 16, MTWThF, 7:00 - 8:05 in McKee 334 1 hr. credit

A study of the educational problems of the low functioning visually impaired child, including identification procedures, general etiology, and learning and training techniques.

EDSE 508-027 Workshop: Optacon Training for Experienced Teachers.

July 6 - July 16, MTWThF, 1:40 - 5:25 in McKee 126 3 hrs. credit

This course includes various aspects related to the Optacon: its historical development, operation and inspection techniques, auxiliary teaching equipment, other accessories, basic elements of the reading process, methodology for teaching elementary level children, application toward independent adult living, use in employment. Enrollment is limited to experienced teachers in Visually Handicapped field.

EDSE 520-009 Severely Emotionally Disturbed.

July 19 - July 30, MTWThF, 3:00 - 4:05 in McKee 230 1 hr. credit

A study of severe emotional problems exhibited by children. Emphasis will be placed on characteristics which might lead to institutionalization and/or special class, if not corrected.

EDSE 510-009 Severely Intellectually Handicapped.

August 2 - August 13, MTWThF, 3:00 - 4:05 in McKee 230 1 hr. credit

A study of assessment and treatment of the severely intellectually handicapped individual. Implications in the education and training process will be examined.



GRADUATE VOCATIONAL TEACHER EDUCATION

Workshop: Simulation and Gaming Techniques in Vocational Education

VTE 508-070 July 19 - 23 2 hrs. credit

(Class meets 1:40 - 5:40 MTWThF)

Two Ideas--Simulation to represent elements of reality and Gaming to stimulate interaction--have been developed into a variety of learning contexts. There will be the three groups--Greeley, Denver, and Colorado based. The Greeley and Denver-based groups will attend a weekly evening seminar meeting. Seminars for those in the Colorado based group will be arranged at the time of enrollment. Curriculum materials will be developed which can be used in vocational programs. (Class meets 7:00 - 10:45 a.m. TTh)

A comprehensive introduction to the age-old technique of fabric design. Exploration of different resist materials, techniques, fabrics, tools and dyes. Individual expression of application of medium and possible combinations with other media. Limited enrollment.

Workshop in Fine Arts: Museum Experience

FA 308/508-2 July 10, 17, 24, 31 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets Saturdays 8:20 - 4:05)

Workshop in Fine Arts: Museum Experience

FA 308/508-22 July 10, 17, 24, 31 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets Saturdays 8:20 - 4:05)

The first class will be held in Carter Hall room 303 on UNC campus with remaining three classes to be in Denver at the

Denver Art Museum. YOU MUST REGISTER FOR THIS CLASS ON REGISTRATION DAY JUNE 14 ONLY.

Denver area teachers have available to them one of the finest museums in the midwest. By becoming familiar with the museum, the teacher and student will gain confidence in their ability to relate the contents of the museum to others in a meaningful way. Emphasis will be placed on approaching the arts of the past so they are not simply monuments of the dead, but are as alive and vital as our own times. Enrollment will be on a first come, first served basis at registration June 14. There will be no preregistration for this class. Specific course requirements will vary according to level of instruction.

Workshop in Fine Arts: Watercolor Painting from Nature.

FA 308/508-32 July 26 - August 6 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 8:20 - 4:05 MTWThF)

Steamboat Springs, Colorado at the Scandinavian Lodge. Experiences in watercolor painting directly from nature. Emphasis will be on the development of a vocabulary of forms which may be directed toward more personal interpretations of nature. Limited enrollment. Specific course requirements will vary with level of instruction. Contact Mr. Fredric Myers, Assistant Professor, Department of Fine Arts, UNC.

Workshop in Fine Arts: RAKU

FA 308/508-5 July 19 - August 13 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 11:00 - 1:25 MTWThF)

Participation and personal involvement in the total process of forming, decorating and firing of pottery by the "process" of Raku is the primary goal of the workshop. Instruction will be given in forming, decorating, glazing, firing and will include construction of a temporary kiln to be used for firing of the ceramic forms.

Workshop in Fine Arts: Metal Casting

FA 308/508-6 June 21 - July 16 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 12:20 - 2:45 MTWThF)

A non-technical approach to experience in the lost-wax and styrofoam-sand casting methods.

Workshop in Fine Arts: Visual Images and Visual Perception

FA 308/508-26 June 21 - July 16 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 12:20 - 2:45 MTWThF)

An introduction to the psychology of art and art education. Use of film and visual materials, some work with art materials, discussion and lecture to explore psychological processes of visual perception and art expression and their development from infancy to the level of the professional artist. Statements from Gestalt, Freudian, Jungian and other psychological neotations will be considered.

Workshop in Fine Arts: Art of the Pre-School Child

FA 308/508-36 July 19 - August 13 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 12:20 - 2:45 MTWThF)

For parents or people interested in teaching. Instructor with long experience working in art with small children will explore the developmental significance of early childhood art through film and other visual materials, discussion and lecture, and direct observation where possible. Developmental patterns, simple curriculum planning, and activities using art materials for home and school will be included.

Workshop in Fine Arts: High Country Nature Photography.

FA 308/508-46 July 19 - August 13 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 12:20 - 2:45 MTWThF)

In the vast resources of our national Rocky Mountain Park and on the beautiful high country MacGregor Ranch, this course will draw upon nature as a source of photography imagery. Color photography will be the vehicle to artistic self-expression for beginner or advanced photographers. The

class will meet three days per week on the MacGregor Ranch with field trips to other areas and two days a week on the Greeley campus for critiques and presentations. Students must provide cameras, film and make transportation arrangements.

Workshop in Fine Arts: Sumi (Ink) Painting
FA 308/508-7 June 21 - July 16 3 hrs. credit
(Class meets 1:40 - 4:05 MTWThF)

Experiences utilizing bamboo brushes and sumi ink, with emphasis upon expressive qualities resulting from experimentation with calligraphic line.

Workshop in Fine Arts: Commercial Design and Layout
FA 308/508-27 June 21 - July 16 3 hrs. credit
(Class meets 1:40 - 4:05 MTWThF)

Experiences with a number of different commercial illustration techniques studied with concepts of advertising layout design. Of particular value to business majors but open to any interested student regardless of his background in formal art training or "artistic ability."

Craft Studio: Fiber Construction
FA 340/540-1 June 21 - July 16 3 hrs. credit
(Class meets 7:00 - 9:25 a.m. MTWThF)

The class will include exploration of traditional textile techniques including loom weaving, non-loom weaving, plaiting, grading, macrame, crochet, and basketry. The object of the course is to transform these traditional methods into contemporary and versatile art forms. Both traditional and unconventional materials will be employed. This class will be structured for students at all levels.

Workshop in Fine Arts: Throwing on the Potters Wheel (Intermediate and advanced).

FA 308/508-42 July 26 - August 6 3 hrs. credit
(Class meets 8:20 - 4:05 MTWThF)

Steamboat Springs, Colorado (Scandinavian Lodge.)

Instruction in wheel throwing techniques will be offered at all levels. Emphasis will be placed upon throwing skills, knowledge of clays, design considerations, decorating techniques, glazing and firing. Students with transportable potter's wheels are encouraged to bring them to the workshop. This is a self-contained workshop. You are able to devote your entire time to improving your throwing abilities since you work, eat, sleep, swim, sauna, and enjoy tennis or hiking on the lodge property. Enrollment is limited and space in the course reserved on first come first served basis. Contact Dr. Herb Schumacher, Professor of Ceramics, Department of Fine Arts.

Food/Nutrition Module: Outdoor Cookery
HEC 249 August 9 - August 13 1 hr. credit
(Class meets 1:40 - 4:05 MTWThF)

An investigation of a variety of methods of preparing meals outdoors.

Seminar: Seminar in Textiles and Clothing
HEC 384/684 August 2 - August 13 3 hrs. credit
(Class meets 9:40 - 12:05 MTWThF)

A course designed to aid teachers in adapting home economics curriculum to the needs of men and boys in the areas of clothing construction, selection and care. Four additional hours to be arranged.

Food/Nutrition Module: Wild Edibles
HEC 449 August 2 - August 6 1 hr. credit
(Class meets 1:40 - 4:05 MTWThF)

An exploration of and experimentation with wild plants as food sources.

Workshop in Home Economics: Environmental Awareness
HEC 508 June 14 - June 18 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 8:20 - 12:05, 1:40 - 4:05 MTWThF)

Increased awareness of environmental influences and their interrelationship to one's near environment will be developed through observation assignments, discussion and readings. Consideration will be given to alignment of resources which affect the well being of individuals in the near environment.

Workshop in Home Economics: Foods - Facts and Fallacies
HEC 508 June 28 - July 9 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 1:40 - 5:25 MTWTh)

Students will investigate beliefs, attitudes and understandings about food superstitions, food taboos; counter-culture beliefs will be discussed in relation to food choices.

Workshop in Home Economics: Creative Approaches to Teaching Consumer Education

HEC 508 June 28 - July 9 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 1:40 - 5:25 MTWTh)

An examination of the process approach and various creative teaching models, particularly applied to the area of consumer education. Students will be involved in the development of teaching strategies and techniques, adapting the material to the age and level of the students with whom they are involved. Graded on an S-U basis.

Workshop in Home Economics: Think Metric
HEC 508 August 2 - August 5 1 hr. credit

(Class meets 1:40 - 4:05 MTWTh)

Metrication is inevitable. The workshop will explain the logic and convenience of the metric system.

Workshop in Home Economics: Textile Dyes from Nature
HEC 508 August 16 - August 20 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 9:40 - 4:05 MTWThF)

Class will focus upon identification and selection of dye plants, preparation and use of mordants and dyes, and creative use of dyed yarns in an individual project.

Workshop in Home Economics: Exploration of Occupations in Home Economics

HECV 508 June 21 - July 2 6 hrs. credit

(Class meets 8:20 - 4:05 MTWTh)

An opportunity to survey home economics occupations through field trips to business and industries in the Denver metropolitan and Greeley area. This course would provide an excellent introduction for the HECV 460, Occupational Home Economics course. It would also be recommended for any teacher communicating job opportunities related to home economics.

A fee of approximately \$20.25 will be assessed for transportation costs. Reservations for the class must be sent to Mrs. Valerie Sorensen, UNC Home Economics Department by May 15.

Workshop in Home Economics: Food Service Workshop
HECV 508 July 5 - July 23 4 hrs. credit

(Class meets 11:00 - 4:05 MTWThF)

A course cooperatively taught by food service and home economics faculty and designed for individuals who wish to upgrade their knowledge and training in food service. Demonstrations and lectures will be given by leaders in the food service industry. Opportunities to practice food service skills will be provided. Enrollments will be limited, and the student is asked to send a written request to Mrs. Valerie Sorensen no later than June 20. A charge will be assessed for food costs.

Workshop in Home Economics: Teaching Reading in Home Economics

HECV 508 July 5 - July 23 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 12:20 - 2:45 MTWTh)

A workshop designed to assist in the effective teaching of home economics through improved level of reading. Included will be techniques for determining student difficulties in reading home economics textbooks and materials, for assessing the reading levels of the materials, and for including the prescribed vocabulary and study skills as part of the home economics lesson. Time will be given in rewriting some materials and preparing teaching aids. Applications of reading skills will include those needed in vocational and occupational programs.

Workshop in Home Economics: Curriculum in Teaching Living Environments

HECV 508 August 2 - August 13 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 12:20 - 2:45 MTWThF)

A workshop designed for exposing teachers to the process based technique of developing curriculum. Students will have an opportunity to examine and experiment with materials developed by the McKnight Company related to living environments. Four additional hours to be arranged.



INDUSTRIAL ARTS

Leathercraft (second four weeks)

IA 216/516-005 July 19 - August 13 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets from 11:00 - 1:25 MTWThF)

Development of the basic skills in leathercraft, including designing, tooling, carving, and constructing leather projects for the industrial arts programs, such as general shop, camp activities, and recreation programs.

World of Construction IACP Workshop

IA 308/508-006 June 22 - July 2 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets from 12:20 - 5:25 MTWThF)

The objective of this workshop is to familiarize the participants with the Industrial Arts Curriculum Project materials developed. Opportunity will be provided for hands on activity and for intensive study of the methods and materials developed by the IACP staff.

In addition to the regular tuition cost for this course there will be an additional charge of \$25 for software and materials. Limited enrollment.

Electronic Circuit Applications--Color TV Fundamentals

IA 308/508-26 July 6 - July 16 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets from 12:20 - 5:25 MTWThF)

Workshop designed for industrial arts teachers and inservice TV-technicians to explain basic principles of color TV to those familiar with basic electronics. Through the courtesy of the Electronics Industries Association and member color TV manufacturers, students will be given an opportunity to analyze the latest color TV's with solid state chassis for a real "hands-on" experience. Field engineers and industry trained instructors will be available for consultation and teaching. Advanced reservations recommended as enrollment is limited. Contact Dr. David Jelden, Professor, Department of Industrial Arts, University of Northern Colorado, Greeley, Colorado 80639.

Alternate Energy Sources

IA 308/508-007 July 19 - August 13 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets from 1:40 - 4:05 MTWThF)

A study of solar, wind and exotic energy sources. Exotic sources such as nuclear, mhd and tidal power. Exercises include construction of solar, wind and simulated nuclear power sources. Field trips for on-site study of each power source studied. Presentations by authorities in each of the energy source fields studied.

Basic Photography (two sessions offered)

IA 342-007 June 22 - July 16 3 hrs. credit

IA 342-027 July 19 - August 13 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets from 1:40 - 4:05 MTWThF for each session)

Fundamentals of camera, lens, photographic materials, and processing. Photography as a means of communication through picture planning and practical photography.

The student must have the permission of the instructor, Mr. Dennis Morimoto, prior to enrolling for the course.

Construction Activities in the Elementary Classroom

IA 359-007 July 19 - August 13 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets from 1:40 - 4:05 MTWThF)

This class is recommended for elementary education majors and special education majors. Industrial arts activities will familiarize the participants with tools and materials that can supplement the on-going curriculum.

Further information may be obtained by contacting Dr. David Olson, Professor, Department of Industrial Arts.

Machine Tool Technology

IA 574-007 June 22 - July 16 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets from 1:40 - 4:05 MTWThF)

A study and operation of modern machine tools, including milling machines, grinding machines and lathes, both engine and turret. In addition, numerical control of modern tooling and the use of precision measuring and test equipment will be studied.

Abracadabra for Business Teachers

BEVE 580-2 June 14 - June 18 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 8:20 - 4:05 MTWThF)

A workshop designed to provide the business teacher with various magic tricks which can be utilized to motivate students in the classroom. Emphasis will be placed on how to coordinate and correlate the magic with classroom content and curriculum. Because of the unique characteristics of this workshop, enrollment will be limited to 25 participants who must arrange for advanced registration through Mr. Charles Beall, Kepner 213, by May 26, 1976.

Readings in Business Education

BEVE 580-6 June 21 - July 23 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 12:20 - 1:25 MTWThF)

This course will place basic emphasis on current research and professional writing in business education. The purpose of the course is to provide the student with knowledge of current philosophy and problems in business education.

Methods in Landmark abc Shorthand

BEVE 580-22 June 14 - June 18 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 9:00 - 12:00 and 1:00 to 4:00 MTWThF)

An introduction to Landmark abc Shorthand. The primary objective is to cover thoroughly the methods used to teach this shorthand in the classroom. A representative of the publisher--one who has both assisted in preparation of materials and taught the system in the classroom--will be the visiting instructor.

Improvement of Cooperative Office Related Class Instruction

BEVE 580-07 August 2 - August 13 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 1:40 - 5:00 MTWThF)

The workshop is designed to assist in the development of individualized learning materials in the office areas. Learning materials will be geared to the training plans of the students. The first part of the workshop will be conducted during the CVA conference on the CSU campus. The second two-thirds will be on the UNC campus the week following CVA. Participants must attend both sections. All participants must contact Dr. Elsie Donnel no later than July 23, 1976.

Integrating Basic Business with a BOE/DE Program

BEVE 580-27 August 2 - August 13 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 1:40 - 5:00 MTWThF)

A workshop designed to provide techniques for integrating basic business and economic education concepts (including consumer education concepts) into the vocational programs. Students will have the opportunity to develop instructional strategies toward this end. The initial week of the workshop will be conducted during the CVA conference on the CSU campus during the week of August 2-6. The second half will be on the UNC campus the following week, August 9-13. Participants must attend both weeks. All participants must contact Dr. Barry L. Van Hook no later than July 23, 1976.

Organization and Administration of Post Secondary Distributive Education Programs

BEVE 581-7 July 19 - July 30 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 1:40 - 5:00 MTWThF)

A workshop designed to provide the student with the skills to establish and maintain the post secondary distributive education mid-management program. Particular attention will be paid to University-State Board relations, students, alternative curriculum design, and alternative delivery systems for the cooperative method of instruction. For further information contact Dr. G. Dean Palmer.

Social Issues in Business

BUS 603-7 July 6 - July 16 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 1:40 - 5:00 MTWThF)

A brief discussion of the historical development of social responsibility and the modern corporation. The major emphasis in the course will deal with an analysis of the social problems of property, civil rights, ecology, and consumerism and how they affect business today. Cases will be used to illustrate the various social issues and what business can do.

JOURNALISM

News People and Their Problems (Down-to-earth Seminar)

JOUR 410-6 June 14 - June 18 2 hrs. credit

(Class meets 1:00 - 5:00 MTWThF)

Five qualified and articulate professional news people--a different person each day--will share their experiences and insights with participants in these seminars for news professionals, journalism teachers and advanced journalism students. Each session will include lecture, open discussion and question-answer periods. Active participation in discussion will be encouraged. Practical problems will be stressed.

Campus Press Freedoms

JOUR 505-2 August 16 - August 20 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 8:00 - 12:00 and 1:00 - 3:00 MTWThF)

This course is designed to give educators sufficient practical knowledge of first-amendment law to understand both the rights of student editors and the constraints within which they must operate. Some topics to be considered will include libel, obscenity, disruption of normal school activities, and "rights of others," distribution of the paper, controversial expression, criticism of school and public officials, the school as publisher, underground newspapers, and the liability of school officials for infringement of first-amendment rights.

High School Newspaper Advisers Workshop

JOUR 505-3 June 14 - June 18 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 9:00 - 12:00 and 1:00 - 4:00 MTWThF)

Designed for beginning and experienced advisers of student newspapers. Organization of the newspaper staff, management techniques, and freedom of the high school press will be covered. New ideas and procedures for publishing student newspapers will be presented and students will be issued materials designed to help them motivate and organize a student newspaper staff.

Public Relations Workshop

JOUR 597-22 August 16 - August 20 3 hrs. credit

(Class meets 8:00 - 12:00 and 1:00 - 3:00 MTWThF)

This concentrated session is designed to be a practical "how-to-do-it" public relations course. Students will participate individually in developing some actual tools of the public relations practitioner. Attention will be focused on improvement of information writing, including news releases, the preparation of publications, development of slide presentations, and writing of a commercial message. Material will have pragmatic application to education, business, industry, social agencies and military public relations.
