Summer 197

Students enrolled in the Summer 1977 term at the University of Northern Colorado will have some new choices offered to them. Along with its usual largenumber of workshops and special courses, the summer session will offer students an opportunity to study in both short-term concentrated courses and in regular term-length ones. This year students may select courses during the following three sessions:

PRE-SESSION:June 13-17.(Ten-week courses begin week of June 13.)**REGULAR SESSION:INTERIM SESSION:**August 15 - September 16.

It is hoped that this new flexibility in course scheduling will best meet the needs of individual students. To assist students in their selection, all courses are listed in the Schedule of Courses with beginning and ending dates, and the Special Course section is divided into the three sessions in which courses are offered. Students are urged to consult their catalogs and advisers to insure that their selections will be applicable toward their degree programs.

Nationally-known artists and speakers, travel-study tours and outstanding faculty and administration also will continue to be features of this summer term as well as the regular school year.

The University

The University of Northern Colorado, granted university status in 1970 in recognition of its extensive graduate and undergraduate programs, was established in 1889 as a state normal school and named the Colorado State College of Education in 1935. Committed to excellence in education, the university is a member of and accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

The university has a 243-acre campus divided into three main parts: The East Campus with housing units and Jackson athletic field; the Central Campus with classroom and administration buildings and faculty housing, and the new Darrell Holmes Campus with its James A. Michener Library, other classroom buildings and dormitories. Campus facilities include a laboratory school, placement service, an off-campus instruction program, an educational resources building center, an instructional materials center, KUNC-FM radio station, bureaus of research, health and counseling services, an alumni association and the Butler-Hancock Hall, the new health, physical education and recreation building.

Laboratory School

Many educational opportunities are available for youngsters. Morning classes are planned by the Laboratory School (kindergarten and grades one through six), the Special Education School and a nursery school conducted by the Home Economics Department. Summer sessions are planned for grades two through twelve by Greeley School District Six. More information on these programs may be obtained through the individual schools or the school district offices.

Greeley

Greeley, a growing city of 57,000, the county seat of agricultural Weld County, is located 30 miles east of the picturesque Rocky Mountain Range and 52 miles north of Denver, the state capital. Founded in 1870 by Horace Greeley and originally known as the Union Colony, the city boasts wide, tree-lined streets and avenues, numbered for easy reference.

Greeley's cultural and recreational opportunities include a community college, a city recreation program, 12 parks, 3 golf courses, 2 historical museums, 2

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public libraries and the Greeley Philharmonic Society, the oldest symphonyorchestra west of the Mississippi River. There are also the new Greeley Mall, a modern, full-carpeted shopping center south of town which contains a variety of shops and restaurants, and several other shopping areas.



Policy

Students applying for admission to the University of Northern Colorado for the summer quarter should complete and return the form on page 66. Additional information required as part of application for admission depends upon the status of the student as defined below. Inquiries concerning the graduate program or graduate admissions should be directed to the Dean of the Graduate School. Undergraduates should contact the Director of Admissions for application forms. The application for the baccalaureate and master's degrees and the graduate student certification program must be accompanied by a \$10.00 transcript evaluation fee.

Graduate Students

The university requires that the Graduate Record Examination Aptitude Test scores accompany the doctoral application. If a student's score is below the minimum acceptable score in the Aptitude Test, he will be denied admission to the doctoral program. Students seeking a graduate degree from the University of Northern Colorado may transfer eight quarter hours toward a master's or Specialist in Education degree and 12 quarter hours toward a doctoral degree. If the work is acceptable to all members of the Oral Comprehensive Examination Committee, a doctoral student may transfer an additional 23 quarter hours of work.

Transfer Students

The University accepts a maximum of 135 quarter hours of transfer credits on undergraduate programs. Credits earned at a junior or community college after completion of the sophomore year, or beyond 96 quarter hours will not be transferable. All degree-seeking students must submit an official application for admission, a transcript of high school studies, two transcripts of previous college work and a health report. Application forms may be obtained by writing to the Director of Admissions.


Freshmen


Students who are entering college for the first time should write to the Director of Admissions for information and application forms. To be eligible to apply for admission, students must graduate in the upper one-half of their class or have scores on the American College Test which are at or above national averages. Other minimal admission standards are defined in the undergraduate catalog.

Special Students

An undergraduate student planning to attend the University of Northern Colorado for the Summer Quarter *only* must return the appropriate forms on page 66 and 67. Attendance for the summer quarter does not assure admission for subsequent quarters. Official application for admission must be made if the student plans to continue his degree program at the University of Northern Colorado.







Programs are offered in the following: Arts and Sciences Teaching Professions Applied and Professional Studies

Three undergraduate degrees are available: B.A., bachelor of arts B.S., bachelor of science B.M., bachelor of music

Majors are offered in the teaching profession by numerous academic departments. Students studying for teacher certification must apply for admission to the Professional Teacher Education Program prior to their junior year.

Courses applicable to pre-law, pre-medicine, pre-dentistry, and preengineering are designed for students who want to begin their studies at UNC.

Because the university operates on a four-quarter basis, all programs of study are available to the summer student. The four-quarter plan can help a student complete his or her undergraduate requirements for graduation in three years, if he or she elects a program of continuous study.


The Graduate School offers advanced programs leading to the master of arts (M.A.), master of music (M.M.), master of music education (M.M.E.), master of science (M.S.), specialist in education (Ed.S.), doctor of arts (D.A.), doctor of education (Ed.D.), doctor of music education (D.M.E.), and doctor of philosophy (Ph.D.) degrees.

Detailed information concerning advanced degrees may be obtained by consulting the 1977-78 Graduate School catalog or by writing to Dr. A.R. Reynolds, Dean of the Graduate School, University of Northern Colorado, Greeley, Colorado 80639.

Course Load and Credit. The normal load for graduate credit applicable to a degree is 15 hours per quarter. Overloads (16 to 19 quarter hours) must be approved by the Dean of the Graduate School. Under no circumstances may a student count in a degree program more than 19 hours of course work in a fall, winter, spring, or summer quarter; more than 15 hours in an eight-week summer quarter; or more than 9 hours in a five-week enrollment.

Master's Degree

The master's degree may be earned in three summer quarters of full-time study. The master's degree is awarded upon completion of a minimum of 45



quarter hours of credit. Candidates must be on campus enrolled as tull-time students for two quarters (at least ten weeks with completing ten quarter hours per quarter; eight weeks attendance and completion of ten quarter hours during the summer quarter) to satisfy the minimum residence requirements.

The master's degree is offered by the following departments or disciplines: Anthropology*; Biological Science; Botany; Business; Chemistry; Communication; Curriculum and Instruction; Earth Science; Economics*; Educational Administration; Educational Media; Elementary Education; English; Fine Arts; Foreign Languages; Geography*; Gerontology; Health, Physical Education and Recreation; History; Home Economics; Industrial Arts; Mathematics; Music; Physics; Political Science*; Psychology, Counseling and Guidance; Reading; Research and Statistical Methodology; Science Education; Social Science; Sociology*; Special Education; Theatre Arts; and Zoology.

* The departments of Anthropology, Economics, Geography, Political Science, and Sociology offer a Master of Arts degree in Social Science. The student may concentrate on the discipline of his choice.

Specialist in Education

The Specialist in Education is a one-year program (minimum of 45 quarter hours) beyond the master's degree, if the area of specialization is compatible with the undergraduate and master's major. A student may be admitted to an Ed.S. degree program with only a baccalaureate degree, but his or her program would require a minimum of 90 quarter hours.

The Ed.S. degree program is not necessarily a program of more courses in the same departmental patterns. It can be a multi- or cross-disciplinary program designed to serve the specific educational needs of a professional teacher. Each applicant for admission to the program will be considered on an individual basis in terms of the area in which he or she wishes to specialize. Although the university does not have the facilities, course offerings or staff to support all areas, it is prepared to provide study opportunities in virtually all facets of teaching.

In some disciplines, the Ed.S. course of study is partially or fully prescribed to satisfy certification requirements. Candidates who choose to continue work toward a doctoral degree on completion of the Ed.S. degree may apply for admission to the doctoral program.

Doctor of Arts


A two-year program beyond the master's degree, the Doctor of Arts is designed to prepare a student for a lifetime of creative teaching at the junior (community) or senior college level together with a supplementary commitment to research. The Doctor of Arts is offered in the following disciplines: Biological Sciences; Chemistry; Geography; History; Mathematics; and Music. The university operates four full quarters per year (fall, winter, spring and summer), and each candidate is required to spend three consecutive quarters in residence in full-time study (at least ten weeks and completion of ten quarter hours per quarter; eight weeks attendance and completion of ten quarter hours during the summer quarters). A student must earn a minimum of 72 quarter hours of credit and pass comprehensive examinations. In addition, he or she must write and defend an acceptable dissertation.

Doctor of Education

A two-year program beyond the master's degree, the Doctor of Education requires course work and research of a professional nature. The university operates four full quarters per year (fall, winter, spring and summer), and each candidate is *required* to spend three consecutive quarters in residence in full-time study (at least ten weeks and completion of ten quarter hours per quarter; eight weeks attendance and completion of ten quarter hours during the summer quarter). A student must earn a minimum of 72 quarter hours of credit and pass comprehensive examinations. In addition, he or she must write and defend an acceptable dissertation.

Doctor of Philosophy

A two-year program beyond the master's degree or a three-year program beyond the baccalaureate degree, the Doctor of Philosophy requires course work



and research to prepare graduate students for creative and meaningful teaching at the college level in either College Student Personnel Administration or Research and Statistical Methodology.

Financial Int

Tuition and Fees

All rates quoted are those estimated for Summer session 1977 and are subject to the provision that the University reserves the right to change tuition, fees, and other charges without notice. As with all state-supported institutions, the rates are affected by legislative action which may not be completed until late spring of any given year. *Note:* The State of Colorado is considering a uniform hourly tuition assessment policy which, if put into practice in the Summer of 1977, might result in a per credit-hour tuition charge which would differ from the estimated amount shown below.

(If a student was not enrolled full-time -- for more than six credit hours -spring quarter, 1977, he or she does not have health insurance coverage for the summer quarter, 1977. This insurance can be obtained only by requesting coverage at registration or at the Student Health Center during the first week of the quarter.)

See the 1977-78 Undergraduate or Graduate School Catalog for other fees which will be applicable in the terms of a particular registration.

Tuition and Student Services Fees are incurred during each guarterly registration period and are due and payable at the time shown on the billing which is mailed to the student each quarter. Charges are assessed for the total of partial or full programs whether taken for credit or non-credit.

Additional Fees

Special Program Fees such as those for bowling, field trips, golf, etc. are billed at cost. Extra charges are incurred for programs leading to the Specialist in Education and doctoral degrees. Consult the 1977-78 Undergraduate or Graduate School catalog for all itemizations of extra fees and assessments. No graduate phasing fees will be altered or refunded if a registrant fails to pursue his program or for any reason drops out of the course of study into which he has been accepted.

Scholarships

Nearly all scholarships or waivers of tuition issued apply only to the fall, winter and spring quarters. Holders of special scholarships having questions about their prospective awards should inquire about their status in the respective departments authorized to confirm their award or in the Office of Financial Aids.

Resident. Non-resident Status

Determination of status as in-state or out-of-state for tuition purposes is fixed at admission. Colorado Revised Statutes 1973 as amended, fix state regulations which apply at all state institutions of higher education in Colorado. If a person wishes to have his or her classification changed from out-of-state to in-state for tuition purposes, he or she must petition for such a change through the Registrar's Office prior to Registration.

Refund Policy

To be eligible for a refund of any kind, the student must present a formal, approved Notice of Withdrawal or an Add-Drop Slip at the Accounting Office. Forms may be obtained from the Records Office.

Partial refunds for full-quarter classes are granted only for early withdrawals. No refunds will be granted for special, short-period classes after the first meeting of the class. Please consult the 1977-78 Undergraduate or Graduate School catalog for the specific refund policies of the University.



Single

University housing is available in residence halls for single men and women. All accommodations in the residence halls include room and board. The rooms are arranged to accommodate two persons per room.

Room and board cost is \$384.00 per person for the eight-week summer quarter.*

Family

The University offers family housing in two residence halls containing housekeeping facilities for married students with one or two children or for couples without children.



Furnished suites with kitchenette in Turner Hall are \$352.00 and in Lawrenson Hall, \$400.00 per family for the eight-week summer quarter.*

Cafeteria meal service is available on an optional basis for families residing in Turner and Lawrenson Halls.

*Rates quoted above are subject to a provision of the Trustees that the university reserves the right to change rates prior to the beginning of any academic quarter.

Off-Campus

Many students find rooms, apartments and houses in the Greeley area. Room and apartment listings are available to any student who contacts the Department of University Housing. Arrangements for accommodations with private householders cannot be made by the Department of University Housing, but must be made by the student directly with the landlord. Both students and landlords are advised to have a clear understanding, preferably in writing, as to facilities, privileges, prices and intended length of tenancy.

Application for Campus Housing

Address correspondence to the Department of University Housing, Gordon Hall, University of Northern Colorado, Greeley, Colorado 80639.

If after applying, the student desires to cancel his application for either single or family housing in the residence halls for summer quarter, he or she should notify the Director of Housing, in writing. The following policy will apply: cancellation for summer quarter is received before May 15, 1977, \$25.00 will be refunded. There are no refunds for applications made and then cancelled after May 16, 1977.

Registration



General Instructions

Proper registration is the responsibility of each student. No person may register for another student. The University does not have facilities for registering "In Absentia" or at times other than those designated in these instructions. Students should read the catalog and know course requirements.

Registration for *ten-week classes ONLY* is scheduled for Monday, June 13. Registration for one-week classes and workshops beginning during the week of June 13 will be held in the assigned classrooms.

Registration for eight-week sessions and workshops beginning on or after June 20 is scheduled for Monday, June 20. Students attending workshops beginning on or after June 20 and eight-week classes should register for their entire summer program on June 20. Students attending workshops only may register in person at the first class session in the assigned classroom.

Ten-week classes begin June 14. Eight-week classes begin June 21. No registration for ten-week classes will be permitted after 3:00 p.m. June 17. No registration for eight-week classes will be permitted after 3:00 p.m. June 24.

1. Obtain Materials

Registration packets for June 13 may be obtained in Gunter Hall, Room 107 on Monday, June 13, between 8:00 a.m. and 11:30 a.m.

Registration packets for June 20 may be obtained in Gunter Hall, Room 107, on either Friday, June 17, between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. or Monday, June 20, between 7:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

2. Contact Adviser

After obtaining your supplies, contact your adviser in his or her office (except undergraduate majors in Anthropology, Business, Economics, Elementary Education, Fine Arts, Geography, History, Home Economics, Psychology [Graduate majors in PCG require a signature], Sociology and Special Education and graduate majors in College Student Personnel Administration and Special Education). If you do not know the name of your adviser, please go to the departmental office of your major. All cards must be completed and the Header-Locator Card must be signed by your adviser before you will be permitted to register.

Unclassified graduate students and those not following a degree program report to Student Council Room, University Center, at Registration. None of the work taken by a graduate student who is enrolled in an unclassified status may be counted in meeting the minimum residence requirements.

Workshops

Registration for one-week classes and workshops beginning during the week of June 13 will be held in the assigned classrooms. Registration for workshops beginning on or after June 20 may be completed at Registration on June 20 or in the assigned classroom on the first day of the particular workshop. Students must register in person at the first class session, if they are not already registered. It is the student's responsibility to learn when his first class meets. Withdrawals from workshops must be made before the workshop is half over.

A student may register for a class for no credit by paying appropriate tuition and fees. No audit or visitors cards are issued -- only "no credit" cards.

Card Pickup

Report to the appropriate department stations in the Ballroom, University Center, to pick up class cards. If you have a schedule conflict, a faculty "trouble shooter" will be available to assist you. If a course is closed for which you are registering, the Second Preference Courses Schedule will be used to make up a complete schedule. Undergraduate students may *not* enroll for 600-700 level courses; juniors and seniors may enroll in 500-level courses with permission. All courses for which you are registering must show on the Header Locator Card and be initialed by the authorized departmental representative. This is your offical study program. Proceed to the checking stations to leave your packet

To Pay Fees

Veterans using the G.I. Bill should report to the Veteran's Administration Office. Students with Financial Aid (Vocational Rehabilitation and all scholarships and grants) report to Office of Financial Aid, Carter Hall, during the week of Registration. Students will be billed for fees and tuition on or about July 1, 1977, at rates per credit-hour as approved at that time and according to their current resident status. Students must present all copies of the bill to the Accounting Office according to their scheduled day as shown on the bill. Payment of the amount due should be made on this day.

A late fee of \$5.00 the first day and \$2.00 for each additional day will be charged.

Students registering for 10-week courses after June 13 or for 8-week courses after June 20 will be assessed a late registration fee at the rate of \$5.00 the first day and \$2.00 each additional day. (See Calendar on Page 9 for last day of Registration.)

To Withdraw

The last day to withdraw from a course is the mid-point of the course. The last date to withdraw from eight- and ten-week courses is July 19, at 12:00 noon. The last date to withdraw from other courses is 3:00 p.m. of the mid-point day (count class days only) of the course.

To Obtain Transcripts

Transcripts for Summer quarter will be available upon request two weeks after the close of the quarter. Transcripts for the Summer interim session will be available upon request two weeks after the close of the interim session.



On April 27, 1972, the faculty of the University of Northern Colorado adopted a calendar that eliminated the three-day final examination schedule. Final examinations will not be scheduled specifically but are to be given at the discretion of the faculty member in accordance with the policy established by the school/college in which the faculty member is assigned. However, classes are expected to meet on all scheduled periods including the last day a class is scheduled in the quarter.

Graduation

Graduation is scheduled at 10:00 a.m., Saturday, August 13, in the Garden Theatre. Students are encouraged to attend. Those who choose not to participate must notify the Office of the Registrar (Graduate School for graduate students) at least two weeks (July 29) prior to graduation so that appropriate addresses can be confirmed and graduation details can be clarified with Colleges, Schools and Departments. Students who participate in graduation are required to wear appropriate academic costume. Caps and gowns may be rented from the University Bookstore. No applications for graduation will be accepted after July 1, 1977.

Summer Interim Session Registration

Registration for summer interim session courses will be conducted in the assigned classroom during the first meeting. Students must register in person at the first meeting. Withdrawals from these courses must be made before 3:00 p.m. of the mid-point day (count class days only) of the course.



Music Tour of England and Scotland

A 14 day tour of England and Scotland offers three options: (1) air fare only, (2) concert tour with the UNC Symphonic Wind Band conducted by Wayman Walker, or (3) a study-tour course with college credit entitled England and the Musical Arts and taught by James Upton.

The course will include the study of English contributions to the development of music and English repertorial materials within the original context. Among areas to be visited will be the British Museum, Cambridge University, Ingatestone Hall, the Victoria and Albert Instrument Division, Canterbury, Salisbury, Bath Abbey, the Chester Museum, Durham and the Russell Collection in Edinburgh.

The band tour itinerary will include London, Stratford-on-Avon, York, Edinburgh and all the English countryside in between. Present and former band members are welcome, and others may join by audition.

Campus Rehearsals are June 4-5, 1977.

Travel is from June 5-19, 1977

Cost is estimated for the full tour at \$960 per person to include Pan American flight with deluxe meal service from Denver, hotels, sightseeing, two meals per day and all ground transportation. Cost does not include tuition for those enrolling in the course. Charter air fare only is available at an estimated \$549. Trip participants need not follow the concert or study tour itineraries and need not be graduates of UNC.

UNC Credit for MUS 498, England and the Musical Arts is two hours (graduate and undergraduate with S-U grading). The course is open to music students, teachers and others with a strong interest in music. Course credit may apply toward general education requirements for non-music majors.

Special Note: Credit and tuition costs can be included in the regular summer session which begins June 20. Enrollment is limited to 25.

Iceland

A study tour of Iceland will be conducted by land and by air to view and investigate features of exceptional geological interest and significance. Classic areas of glaciation, volcanism, and rifting will be examined in this country which is located astride the Mid-Atlantic Ridge. The course will include field studies as well as classroom lectures and seminar discussions before and after the tour.

Dates for the two separate tours are July 21 - August 11 and August 11 - September 1.

UNC credit is ten quarter hours graduate or undergraduate for GEOL 597, Geology of Iceland. Prerequisite is one introductory geology course.

Approximate cost is \$1,800 and includes all tour expenses and tuition.

Graduate degree residence requirements. Candidates for graduate degrees must satisfactorily complete a minimum of ten weeks attendance and ten quarter hours (eight hours attendance and completion of ten quarter hours during summer quarter) of graduate credit in the campus program to satisfy the residence requirements for that quarter.

No special courses which end later than August 19 may be counted to satisfy degree requirements if the student is graduating summer quarter, 1977. A student who wishes to count a course ending later than August 19 in his degree program must postpone graduation until fall quarter, 1977, or later.

Topics in Field Biology - Rocky Mountain National Park and Pawnee National Grasslands

BIO 480 6 hrs. credit June 13-24 (Class meets 8:20-5:30 on campus; 8 days to be spent in the field.)

Workshop designed to increase understanding and awareness of the unique biological features of two national preserves, Rocky Mountain National Park and Pawnee National Grasslands. First two days to be spent on the UNC campus for field orientation and preparation for field work; three days in the field on the grasslands and five in the mountains, using the UNC mountain campus. Concentrated study of plants and animals and their interactions as well as the impact of human populations on these natural communities. Topics explored will depend on the interest and abilities of the students. Approximate \$65 cost to cover food, field facilities and transportation in the field. Workshop in Asian Humanities

HUM 508-502 4 hrs. credit June 13-24 (Class meets 8:20-12:05, MTWThF)

Study of some of the major classics of Indian, Chinese, and Japanese literature, and an examination of some of the important art forms of each country. Emphasis will be upon the Japanese, with a study of some of their contemporary literary and visual arts. Students to be encouraged to pursue individual areas of interest.

Mathematics Teachers Workshop: Learning Disabilities and Mathematics MED 577-2 3 hrs. credit June 13-17 (Class meets 8:20-11:20 and 12:20-3:20 MTWThF, Candelaria 152)

Principal resource person will be Dr. Carole Greenes, Boston University. Course to focus on the characteristics of the learning-disabled child and ways to differentiate these children from low achievers and the emotionally disturbed, the relevant mathematics content for learningdisabled children, and examples and strategies for teaching them. Workshop: Designing and Evaluating Educational Programs EDCI 508-506 2 hrs. credit June 13-18

EDCI 508-506 2 hrs. credit June 13-18 (Class meets 1:40-5:40 MTWThFS)

All persons interested in taking this course must contact the Department of Curriculum and Instruction no later than Wednesday, June 1, 1977.

Workshop designed to provide practicing and aspiring curriculum leaders and administrators with skills and instruments for designing and evaluating educational programs. Topics included: organizing a program definition group, developing curricula for individualized instruction and independent study, designing an action plan for school improvement, designing and implementing a school-wide evaluation plan, using norm-referenced and criterion-referenced tests, evaluating in the affective domain, alternatives to testing, and reporting to parents. Workshop staff to be drawn from UNC, the Colorado Department of Education, and school districts with advanced program design and evaluation projects.

Educational Foundations Workshop: Implementing Humanistic Changes in Education

EDF 508, EDF 690 9 hrs. credit June 13-July 8 (Class meets 9:30-3:00 MTWThF)

Workshop designed to provide insight, rationale and skills for implementing humanistic changes in education. Major issues to be explored: What is humanistic education? What does it promise and offer to American education? How is creativity fostered through it? What life skills can be promoted by its approaches? How can I utilize its teaching strageties? Format to include a variety of minilectures, activities, consultation with outside resource people and participant-sharing. Teams of participants from the same school, or school system, are encouraged to attend. About onethird of class time to be devoted to piano performance. Brief repertoire lists (easy to difficult) representing the several styles will be available. Music Workshop: The Concert Band; Its History, Literature and Programming

Workshop geared toward the public school band director whether at the elementary, middle school, junior high or senior high school level. Basic objective is to stimulate participants to review and re-evaluate current philosophies prevailing in today's public schools about the concert band. Four main topics to be considered in a lecture-discussion format: (1) Chronology of the evolution of the concert band movement; (2) transcriptions and their role in the concert band curriculum; (3) programming for the students and the audience; and (4) analysis of original wind-band literature. Music Workshop: Advanced Solo Horn Literature MUS 498-526 1 hr. credit June 13-17 (Class meets 12:20-2:20 MTWThF)

In-depth look at a dozen outstanding solo works from the Classic, Romantic and Contemporary periods with emphasis placed on suitability to the high school hom player. Psychology, Counseling and Guidance Principles of Biofeedback Control

PSY 499-26 4 hrs. credit June 20-August 12 (Class meets 12:20-2:45 TTh, McKee 221-222.)

An applied course intended to familiarize the student with biofeedback equipment and its functioning. Students required to operate and condition themselves on different biofeedback devices including temperature, electromyogram (EMG), and electroencephalogram (EEG) feedback. It is recommended that this course be taken concurrently with the other biofeedback courses.

Physiological Aspects of Biofeedback

PSY 499-6 3 hrs. credit June 20-August 12 (Class meets 12:20-1:25 MWF, McKee 221-222.)

Physiological events which underlie EEG, EMG, temperature and other biofeedback modes, and how the general concepts of positive and negative feedback occur naturally as body-state regulating systems. Includes a discussion of the various neuromuscular and other pathologies being treated with biofeedback therapy. It is recommended that this course be taken concurrently with the other biofeedback courses.

Clinical Applications of Biofeedback

PCG 508-47 3 hrs. credit June 20-August 12 (Class meets 1:40-2:45 MWF, McKee 143.)

Review of current therapeutic techniques with biofeedback with special attention to technician/therapist interaction. To cover proper techniques for assessing progress and possible problems during therapy, as well as ethics and special responsibilities of the biofeedback technician. It is recommended that this course be taken concurrently with the other biofeedback courses.

Marriage Counseling

PCG 508-70 1 hr. credit

Dr. Carlfred Broderick, Director of the Marriage and Family Counseling Clinic and teacher, University of Southern California; editor of the *Journal of Marriage and Family Counseling*, and member of the Board of Directors, American Association of Marriage and Family Counseling, will present theoretical background of marriage counseling, his own case histories, and a demonstration of marriage counseling.

Interdisciplinary Courses

Graduate Vocational Teacher Education Workshop: Post-Secondary Education/Work Programs

VTE 508-001 3 hrs. credit July 11-14 (Class meets 8:00-5:00 MTWTh)

Designed to provide personnel from junior/ community colleges, area vocational-technical schools, and local school districts with adult programs an opportunity to plan and develop a comprehensive program which coordinates such education/work programs as: coopera-16 tive education, work-study, work experience, work exposure, clinical experiences, etc. Output from the workshop will be a post-secondary education/work guide. VTE 509-006 1 hr. credit June 22-August 10 (Class meets for luncheons from 12:20-1:20 Wednesdays, Alcove B, University Center)

Six Wednesday luncheons to discuss the following seminar topics: (1) Federal VE Legislation; (2) Curriculum Development and Education Technology; (3) Evaluation Concerns and Constructs; (4) UNC's VE Research Activities; (5) Post-secondary VE; and (6) Job Placement. Students should enroll for this seminar at the beginning of the summer quarter and meet for the first session (June 22) in Alcove B of the University Center.

Workshop: Simulation and Gaming Techniques in Vocational Education

VTE 508-027 2 hrs. credit July 18-22 (Class meets 1:40-5:40 MTWThF)

Two ideas -- simulation to represent elements of reality and gaming to stimulate interaction -- have been developed into a variety of learning contexts. This workshop to concentrate on techniques and application of educational games as they specifically pertain to vocational education. Because of restricted room space, enrollment may be limited and participants need to arrange for enrollment by July 5 with Dora Johnson, Gunter 103. S-U grading.

Health Occupations Education

Workshop: Developing Simulation Materials for Health Occupations Clinical Experiences

VTE 508-026 2 hrs. credit July 18-27 (Class meets 12:20-1:25 July 18-22 and 12:20-4:10 July 25-27)

Due to limited clinical experiences for students in rural areas and restrictions on use of clinical facilities in metropolitan areas, the need for simulating clinical experiences within the educational institution becomes important for health occupations programs. Methods out-lined in the workshop on simulation and gaming techniques in vocational education (VTE 508-027 July 18-22), will be applied to health occupations programs. Workshop to concentrate on developing guidelines and structuring the educational environment for those simulations. Interested individuals should contact Dora Johnson, Gunter 103, July 5. Prerequisite: VTE 508-027 Workshop Sim Gam Tech VE.

Workshop: ICARE (Instrument for Comprehensive and Relevant Education)

VTE 508-002 3 hrs. credit June 23-24, July 7-8 (Class meets 1:40-5:40 Th June 23 and July 7 and 8:20-4:10 F June 24 and July 8)

Workshop to present a systematic approach to the assessment of health instructor competence and improvement of instruction. Process focuses on what the instructor does (teaching activities) in contrast to teacher characteristics. This workshop will prepare health professionals in the use of ICARE instruments and concepts. Interested individuals should contact Dora Johnson, Gunter 103, by June 10. S-U grading.

Workshop: Program Implementation of ICARE

VTE 508-006 2 hrs. credit July 11-14 (Class meets 12:20-5:40 M-Th)

Focus will be to assist participants in developing evaluation techniques based on ICARE materials and concepts for use within a vocational education program. Examples of such materials: evaluation for programs, student selection, clinical experiences, student-directed instruction, etc. Individuals interested in this workshop must have completed a basic ICARE program and should contact Dora Johnson, Gunter 103, by June 15. S-U grading.

Vocational Teacher Education

Abracadabra for Vocational Teachers

VTE 508-007 2 hrs. credit (Class meets 1:40-5:45 MTWThF) July 25-29

Workshop designed to provide the vocational teacher with various magic tricks which can be used to motivate students in the classroom. Emphasis placed on how to coordinate and correlate the magic with classroom content and curriculum. Because of the workshop's unique characteristics, enrollment will be limited to 25 participants who should arrange for advanced registration through Mr. Charles Beall, Kepner 213, by May 27.

School of the Arts

Fine Arts

Workshop in Fine Arts: Pottery Potpourri

FA 308/508-32 3 hrs. credit July 25-August 5 (Class meets 8:20-4:15 MTWThF, Steamboat Village, Colorado)

Workshop to enable students of varying skills to participate in a variety of experiences with clay. Handbuilding, throwing on the potter's wheel or a combination of both. Demonstrations, design considerations, constructive critiques, slide lectures, glazing, kiln stacking and firing to be included.

Workshop in Fine Arts: Human Arts Multi-Environment for Meaning

FA 308/508-42 3 hrs. credit July 18-August 12 (Class meets 8:20-10:45 MTWThF, Carter 303)

There is a great concern today with problems of our environment, specifically the physical environment. But what about the other environments that affect our perception of reality like the political, social, religious, metaphysical, and psychological? Purpose of this course is to investigate the multi-environments which confront the creative person through a twofold process; the first part, a theoretical, conceptual, experiental, and historical exploration of different environments, followed by a second stage of individual interpretations through self-selected media. Emphasis to be placed on student's increased awareness of environments which shape our perceptions and on the creative and imaginative interpretation of that awareness into artistic forms. Not a course on technique per se, open to all creative persons in all forms of expression whether they be art, drama, writing, dance, etc.

Workshop in Fine Arts: Multi-Arts

FA 308/508-1 3 hrs. credit June 20-July 15 (Class meets 7:00-9:25 MTWThF, Carter 303)

Course designed for persons who would wish to "take a course" in art without feeling the competitive stress from other students with extensive backgrounds in art. Instruction to be provided for various levels of competence and in various media including basic drawing, painting (oil, acrylics, watercolor, and mixed media), sculpture, and ceramics. Student may work in one media for the duration of the workshop or several; multi-media approach also will be accommodated. Instruction to be individualized with weekly critiques.

Workshop in Fine Arts: Comparative Arts-Arts in Revolt.

FA 308/508-5 3 hrs. credit June 20-August 12 (Class meets 11:00-12:05 MWF, Carter 303)

Robert Brustein in his Theatre of Revolt characterized developments in the theatre from 1850 to the present as being in the process of revolt, specifically the messianic, social and existential revolt. Course will use his book as the theoretical construct for a comparative study of drama and the other arts of music, art, and architecture to see if his theories have broader application. Course to stress the interrelationships between the arts with special emphasis on how the arts provide a means to understanding culture and perhaps even our own perceptions of reality.

Workshop in Fine Arts: Fiber Structures

FA 308/508-2 3 hrs. credit July 18-August 12 (Class meets 8:20-10:45 MTWThF, Guggenheim 206)

Workshop structured for intermediate and advanced fiber artists. Emphasis on contemporary fiber structure using floor loom weaving, off-loom weaving, knotting, netting, plaiting, braiding, crochet, coiling, hooking, batik, stitchery, etc. Objective will be to transform these traditional methods into contemporary and versatile art forms.

Workshop in Fine Arts: Off-Loom Weaving

FA 308/508-3 3 hrs. credit June 20-July 15 (Class meets 9:40-12:05 MTWThF, Guggenheim 206)

Survey of the many simple frame constructions suitable for weaving simple projects to more advanced individualized creations. Types covered: strip and clamp, back-strap, inkle, pinned warp, weighted-warp, etc. Exploration of the various weaving techniques that adapt themselves to this style of weaving: wrapping, knotting, twining, lace weave and pile weaves. Recommended for persons taking Fiber Structures second half of summer quarter.

Workshop in Fine Arts: Environmental Sculpture FA 308/508-6 3 hrs. credit June 20-July 15 (Class meets 12:20-2:45 MTWThF, Kepner 13)

Direct experience in the development of sculptured forms uniquely situated in environmental settings. Working in a variety of materials at sites in the mountains, on the Pawnee Grasslands, and at the University, students to produce sculptures expressly related to site and situation. Attention given to the work of other environmental artists and their impact on the art world.

Workshop in Fine Arts: Small Film Production

FA 308/508-26 3 hrs. credit July 18-August 12 (Class meets 12:20-2:45 MTWThF, Guggenheim 106)

Working with Super 8 and Regular 8 equipment, students to produce short unique films with emphasis on camera techniques, editing and development of visual continuity and sequence. No previous art or film making experience necessary.

Workshop in Fine Arts: Primitive Pottery

FA 308/508-22 3 hrs. credit July 9, 16, 23, 30 August 6, 13, 20 (Class meets 8:20-4:15 Saturdays, Kepner 122)

Students to dig and to experiment with local clays. Primitive outdoor firing methods to be utilized. Class includes field trips to dig clay, visit to Denver Art Museum and a weekend in Santa Fe.

Workshop in Fine Arts: Crafts for the Elementary and Middle School

FA 308/508-25 3 hrs. credit June 20-July 15 (Class meets 11:00-1:25 MTWThF, Kepner 122)

Course specifically designed for the elementary and middle school teacher. Focus on direct experience of and experimentation with a variety of original materials and techniques. Students brought into contact with materials in nature and the everyday environment.

Crafts Studio: Batik

FA 340/540-1 3 hrs. credit June 20-July 15 (Class meets 7:00-9:25 MTWThF, Guggenheim 206)

Comprehensive introduction to the age-old technique of fabric design, with exploration of different resist materials, techniques, fabrics, tools and dyes. Individual expressions of application of medium and possible combinations with other media.

Workshop in Fine Arts: Sumi Painting

FA 308/508-7 3 hrs. credit June 20-July 15 (Class meets 1:40-4:15 MTWThF, Kepner 5)

Experiences using bamboo brushes and sumi ink, with emphasis upon expressive qualities resulting from experimentation with calligraphic line.

Home Economics

Reading in Vocational Home Economics

HECV 464/664-001 3 hrs. credit July 11-21 (Class meets 7:00-10:45 MTWTh)

Strategies for helping students read home economics materials. Implementation at Bishop-Lehr school.

Workshop in Home Economics: Textile Dyes from Nature

HEC 508-006 3 hrs.	credit	August 1-11
(Class meets 12:20-4:15	MTWTh)	

Focuses upon identification and selection of dye plants, preparation and use of mordants and dyes, and creative use of dyed yarns in an individual project.

Workshop in Home Economics: Think Metric

HEC 508-007	1 hr. credit	July 5-8
(Class meets 1)	:40-4:15 TWThF)	

Metrication is inevitable. Workshop to explain the logic and convenience of the system.

Workshop in Home Economics: Who's Who and Right in Nutrition

HEC 508-027	2 hrs. credit	July 11-15
(Class meets 1:4	0-5:25 MTWThF)	

Course evaluating the research findings and publications of past and present nutrition scientists and pseudoscientists.

Workshop in Vocational Home Economics: Exploration of Careers in Child Care/Hospitality/Food Service

HECV 508-002 4 hrs. credit July 5-15 (Class meets 8:20-1:25 TWThF)

Workshop designed for exposing teachers to process-based education and career exploration in home

economics. Students to examine and experiment with materials developed by the McKnight Publishing Company in the areas of child care, hospitality, and food service.

Exploration of Occupations in Home Economics HECV 566-002 6 hrs. credit July 18-29 (Class meets 8:20-4:15 MTWThF)

Survey home economics occupations through field trips to business and industries in the Denver metropolitan and Greeley areas. Fee of approximately \$25 for transportation costs. Reservations for the class must be made with Mrs. Doris Walters, Home Economics Department, By May 15.

World Food Problems

HEC 657-002 3 hrs. credit June 21-July 1 (Class meets 8:20-12:05 TWThF)

Interrelationship of food supply and world conditions, problems of production, marketing, U.S. consumer practices and protection, and costs of meeting nutritional needs.

Industrial Arts

Digital Circuits in CB/TV

IA 308/508-006 3 hrs. credit (Class meets 12:20-4:15 MTWThF) July 5-15

Course in two sections: approximately one week to be spent on CB radio, single sideband transmission, FCC rules and regulations and variations in circuit operation; second section to deal with fundamental circuit operation and servicing techniques for basic color television. New sets and servicing equipment provided by the Electronic Industries Association for the workshop. Enrollment limited to 25 students; advance reservations strongly recommended. Official registration for the class July 5, during the first class meeting. Total cost \$20 per student (both in-state and out-of-state) to be paid when registering. For students taking other courses during the summer, the \$20 fee is in addition to tuition and fees for those courses. For advance reservations and further information, contact Dr. David Jelden, Department of Industrial Arts.

Manufacturing Technology Workshop

IA 308/508-007 3 hrs. credit June 21-July 15 (Class meets 1:40-4:15 MTWThF)

Basic course concerned with the concepts and techniques associated with manufacturing technology. Topics include research and design, manufacturing processes and distribution. Classroom activities include both lecture/demonstration and laboratory experience. Enrollment limited. For further information contact Dr. John Kruger, Department of Industrial Arts.

Solar and Alternate Energy Systems Design

IA 308/508-027 3 hrs. credit July 18-August 12 Program emphasizing the design of solar and alternate energy systems for the home. This technical course to use up-to-date techniques and computations in solar energy design and installations. Class enrollment limited; advance reservations recommended. For further information contact Dr. Wendell L. Roy, Department of Industrial Arts.

Following are courses less than eight weeks long. For further information contact Dr. Robert G. Hammond, Chairman, Department of Industrial Arts.

Woodturning

IA 257/557 2 hrs. credit July 18-August 11 Basic skills and related techniques in faceplate and spindle woodtuming.

Furniture and Cabinet Making

IA 353/553 3 hrs. credit June 21-July 15 Design and construction of period and modern furniture; study of production methods of industry; upholstery, and wood finishing.

Orientation to Computer Assisted/Managed Instruction

IA 426/626 3 hrs. credit June 22-July 15 Orientation-level course in using the computer as both

instructional and management tool. Emphasis on systems terminology, basic program language for classroom teachers, and procedure for converting traditional teacher-lecture materials to computer-managed instruction. Opportunities to experience an interactive and noninteractive instruction program. Discussion on commercial CAI/CMI systems presently available to public school personnel.

Problems of Design in the Graphic Arts

IA 444/644 3 hrs. credit June 21-July 15 Centered around graphic arts problems found in individual projects with emphasis upon teaching students to recognize, appreciate and use principles of design on the printed page.

Problems in Drafting and Planning

IA 462/662 3 hrs. credit July 18-August 12 Objectives, course content, shop organization, evaluation and problems of teaching the various phases of metalwork.

Introduction to Color Photography

IA 542 3 hrs. credit June 21-July 15 Study and application of color slide photography as a tool of graphic communication. Emphasis upon transformation of photographic ideas into effective graphic representations.

Advanced Welding

IA 572 3 hrs. credit June 21-July 15 Processes and principles of welding, including oxyacetylene, arc, TIG and MIG. Consideration given to principles of teaching, course content, welding supplies and suitable equipment for teaching welding at the secondary and junior college levels.

Jewelry Design and Construction

IA 573 3 hrs. credit July 18-August 12 Basic processes in jewelry construction including soldering, casting, stone cutting, simple silversmithing and use of appropriate equipment.

Problems of the Metal Shop

IA 675 3 hrs. credit July 18-August 12 Advanced study in the organization of both unit and general metal shops and shop practice handled on a seminar basis, giving graduate students opportunity to work on problems in the field.

BEVE 580-021 1 hr. credit July 12-13 (Class meets 1:00-4:00 T and 8:00-4:00 W)

To include areas such as working with the University consultant, evaluation, extra class activities, professional growth, first teaching experiences, planning responsibilities, orientation and conferences. Confirm enrollment by June 20; see introductory paragraph.

Individualization of Instruction -- BOE

BEVE 580-031 1 hr. credit July 14-15 (Class meets 8:00-4:00 Th and 8:00-11:00 F)

To emphasize the use of Automated Instructional (A-I) equipment for the teaching of typing and shorthand. Emphasis on the actual use of A-I equipment, materials and evaluation. Confirm enrollment by June 20; see introductory paragraph.

BOE Advisory Committee Seminar

BEVE 580-041 1 hr. credit July 14-15 (Class meets 8:00-4:00 Th and 8:00-11:00 F)

To emphasize organization, use, and examination of BOE Advisory Committee responsibilities. Practical application of the concept of BOE Advisory Committees will be made. Confirm enrollment by June 20; see introductory paragraph.

BOE Department Head Responsibilities

BEVE 580-051 1 hr. credit July 15-16 (Class meets 1:00-4:00 F and 8:00-4:00 S)

To emphasize the responsibilities of a one-person department as well as a large department. Budgeting, state forms, equipment, and other topics included. Content geared toward secondary and post-secondary. Confirm enrollment by June 20; see introductory paragraph.

Developing and Using Distributive Education Advisory Committees

BEVE 580-007 1 hr. credit June 20-23 (Class meets 1:40-4:05 MTWTh)

Workshop designed to provide the distributive education teacher-coordinator with the skills and knowledge necessary to plan, organize, and use an advisory committee effectively. Emphasis on simulation activities, including critical incidences, role conflict and values clarification.

Effective Training Plans for Distributive Education BEVE 580-027 1 hr. credit June 27-30 (Class meets 1:40-4:05 MTWTh)

Workshop designed to provide the distributive education teacher-coordinator with effective processes to develop and use training plans. Emphasis on correlating and managing stated training plan experiences with classroom instruction.

DECA Competency Activities

BEVE 580-037 1 hr. credit (Class meets 1:40-4:05 TWThF) July 5-8

Workshop designed to provide the distributive education teacher-coordinator with the fundamentals of DECA competency-based activities. Emphasis on process implementation and product use of DECA's competencybased delivery system.

Distributive Education Competency Pattern Instruction

BEVE 580-047 1 hr. credit July 11-14 (Class meets 1:40-4:05 MTWTh)

To investigate and compare various distributive occupations competency patterns of instruction. Samples of competency-pattern instruction material to be reviewed and evaluated. Students to develop segments of instruction using competency pattern concepts and information.

Distributive Education Project Plan

BEVE 580-057 1 hr. credit July 18-21 (Class meets 1:40-4:05 MTWTh)

Distributive education project plan instruction concept and methods of implementation to be investigated and discussed in relation to secondary and post-secondary distributive education programs and the cooperative vocational education plan. Students to develop a delivery system for a project method of instruction.

Workshop in Consumerism

BUS 508-006 3 hrs. credit (Class meets 1:00-4:00 MTWThF) June 20-July 1

Workshop to survey the consumerism movement and evaluate materials which might be helpful to consumers. Instructor, Dr. Stewart M. Lee, is nationally known for his work with various consumer materials and consumer action.

Social Issues in Business

BUS 603-007 3 hrs. credit (Class meets 1:40-5:00 MTWThF) July 5-15

Brief discussion of the historical development of social responsibility and the modern corporation. Major emphasis on an analysis of the social problems of property, civil rights, ecology, and consumerism and how they affect business today. Cases to be used to illustrate the various social issues and what business can do.

Journalism

Workshop: Opinion Formation

JOUR 496-006 3 hrs. credit June 20-July 1 (Class meets 12:20-3:20 MTWThF)

How do the media affect the individual in the socialization process? This and other questions will be addressed in small- and large-group discussions. Other topic areas to include: effect of opinion on the political process, nature of political reporting, advertising, propaganda, semantical questions, and the dynamics of Watergate as related opinion and the media.

Newswriting Methods

JOUR 591-003 3 hrs. credit June 20-August 12 (Class meets 9:40-10:45 MWF)

Innovative approach to the study and development of fundamental journalistic skills. Designed primarily for graduate students who wish to update writing and reporting skills; course is also open to students with good language skills who wish to learn journalistic techniques.

Public Relations Workshop

JOUR 597-006 3 hrs. credit July 5-15 (Class meets 12:20-3:35 MTWThF)

Concentrated session to discuss briefly the philosophy of public relations, but primary concern is the practical "how-to-do-it" of public relations. Designed for education, business, industry, social agencies, and military public relations. Visiting PR authorities to be guest lecturers.

Physical Education for the Handicapped

HPER 508-007 3 hrs. credit July 11-22 (Class meets 1:40-4:40 MTWThF)

Workshop for teachers with a background in physical education to assist them in providing programs for handicapped students in accordance with Public Law 94-142.

 2 hrs. credit

 (Class meets 1:40-5:00 TWThF)

New offering designed to prepare teachers to provide driver education for the physically handicapped.

Driver and Traffic Safety Education II

Supervising Elementary Teaching of Music

MUS 612-013 3 hrs. credit (graduate students only) June 20-July 22

(Class meets 7:00-10:00 p.m. MW)

To cover procedures for supervising music program in the elementary grades, cooperative curriculum building, planning courses of study and units of work, the induction of the beginning teacher, human relations, and in-service education of the classroom music teacher.

School of Special Education and Rehabilitation

Optacon for Pre-Service Teachers of Visually Handicapped Children

EDSE 508-007 3 hrs. credit June 20-August 12 (Class meets 1:40-4:05 TTh)

Teachers learn operation of the Optacon in order to teach blind youths how to read print materials by means of the machine. Maximum of ten students. Only with consent of instructor; applicants must contact Dr. Grace Napier, McKee L140, well in advance of registration day.



August 15 - September 16

Although open to all interested and qualified students, courses included in the Interim Session, August 15 - September 16, have been selected as especially appropriate for entering freshmen and transfer students. ZOO 105 4 hrs. credit (6 hrs. lecture, 6 hrs. lab/week) August 22-September 16

(Class meets 7:00-8:05 MWF; lab, 7:00-10:45 TTh)

Introduction to human biology with emphasis on general body organization, tissue histology, genetics, embryology, medical parasitology and a survey of basic organ structure and function. Designed to give nursing students a foundation for more advanced courses in human anatomy and physiology. Credit not allowed Biological Science majors.

Chemistry

CHEM 100

Introductory Chemistry

3 hrs. credit (6 hrs. lecture/week, no lab) August 22-September 16

(Class meets 12:20-2:45 MWF)

Introduces student to basic concepts in chemistry. Credit not allowed toward a chemistry major or minor; course can be used as part of general education requirement.

ENG 102-903 3 hrs. credit August 22-September 16 (Class meets 9:40-12:05 MWF)

The second quarter of elementary expository writing with instruction in diction, style, tone, logical thinking, the organization of well-developed reports, and writing a research paper.

Creative Writing: Introduction to Poetry

ENG 240-903 4 hrs. credit August 22-September 16 (Class meets 9:40-12:05 MWThF)

An introduction to the techniques involved in writing poetry.

Foreign Language

Elementary Spanish III

SPAN 103-902 5 hrs. credit August 22-September 16 (Class meets 8:20-10:45 MTWThF)

Intensive review of Spanish for students who have had some Spanish in high school or some other contact with

the language, but do not feel qualified to enter 200-level courses. Designed especially for students desiring to continue Spanish in the fall and for students interested in bilingual education. Will concentrate on speaking and listening skills while presenting the essentials of grammar. (The above workshop will also be offered August 29-September 23.)

Anglo-America

GEOG 148-902 5 hrs. credit August 22-September 16

(Class meets 8:20-10:45 MTWThF)

Regions of the U.S. and Canada and their interdependence. Land use and social economic problems emphasized.

Instructor Course Unit Word Power

ICU 110-901 4 hrs. credit August 22-September 16 (Class meets 7:00-9:25 MTWF)

Acquisition of new words and effective use of them through care and taste. Includes levels of usage; urges specific rather than general expression, fresh rather than trite diction; stresses conciseness and exactness of diction; encourages a feeling for words.

Science and the Ascent of Man

ICU 114-906 3 hrs. credit August 22-September 16 (Class meets 12:20-2:45 MWF)

A non-mathematical study of human history as seen from the scientist's viewpoint, following the recent television series and book by J. Bronowski.

Mathematics

Intermediate Algebra

MATH 123-903 5 hrs. credit August 22-September 16 (Class meets 9:40-12:05 MTWThF)

A self-paced course in algebra covering the elementary concepts of algebra through quadric equations. Emphasis on the function concept. Systems of linear equations considered. Prerequisite: One year high school algebra and one year high school geometry.

Philosophy

Morality and Individual Ideals

PHIL 150-902 4 hrs. credit August 22-September 16 (Class meets 9:40-12:05 MTWF)

Designed to serve as a first course in philosophy, and in particular, as an introduction to selected topics in normative and critical ethics. Attention given to such topics as the concept of moral responsibility, the problem of the nature of relation between individual aims and moral obligations.

(The above workshop will also be offered August 29-September 23.)

Political Science International Relations

PSCI 220-903 4 hrs. credit August 22-September 16 (Class meets 9:40-12:05 MTWF) Introductory study of the basic principles and problems of the international political system.

Science

Energy: Man and the Crisis

SCI 107-902 3 hrs. credit August 22-September 16 (Class meets 8:20-10:45 MWF)

Non-mathematical study of basic concepts of energy as they relate to man and his environment. Topics include fundamental principles and limitations of energy conversion, man's energy requirements, environmental impact of large-scale energy uses, energy sources -- fossil, nuclear, solar. Underlying causes of the impending energy crisis to be covered in detail and possible future energy technology alternatives to be discussed.

Sociology

Principles of Sociology

SOC 100-906 5 hrs. credit August 22-September 16 (Class meets 12:20-2:45 MTWThF)

Study of social organization, culture, socialization, social stratification, associations, collective behavior, population and ecology with detailed applications to the functioning of U.S. society today.

Social Problems

SOC 145-913 3 hrs. credit August 22-September 16 (Class meets 6:00-9:15 p.m. MW)

Designed to help the student understand some of the complex problems of our society from a sociological frame of reference. The student will look at such things as poverty, slums, wars, alcoholism, mental illness, drug addition and prostitution in the context of American society.

Social Psychology

SOC 310-902 3 hrs. credit August 22-September 16 (Class meets 8:20-10:45 MTW)

Study of social communication in human groups, identification of mutually dependent elements in the human group and the human group as an organic whole. Case study approach used. Emphasis on leadership.

College of Education Research and Statistical Methodology

Introduction to Graduate Study and Research RSM 600-902 3 hrs. credit August 15-26

(Class meets 9:05-12:05 MTWThF) Orientation to graduate study in general and the na-

ture and methods of research in particular. Emphasis on student interests with reading and critiquing of research publications in their academic areas. Required of all firstyear graduate students (except for those in departments which have substitutes for this course).

Interdisciplinary Courses Vocational Teacher Education

Health Occupations Instructional Design

This program in health occupations is a series of one and one-half day, one quarter hour modules relating to health occupations' instructional design. The coordinated program is so structured that an individual can enroll in all or any combination of three modules (minimum enrollment required) depending on their need. The modules are required for individuals who will be entering teaching during the fall session and are available in place of Orientation to Teaching (VE 270) offered by Colorado State University. Major areas included are occupational analysis, performance objectives, classroom evaluation, instructional methods and media utilization in health occupations. These modules will be offered in Denver. Interested individuals should contact Carlene Gibson, Gunter 103, by August 1 for specific location. BUS 221-902 4 hrs. credit (Class meets 8:20-12:20 MTWThF) September 6-16

Emphasis on principles of accounting as they apply to the measurement and reporting of assets, liabilities, ownership equities, periodic revenues and periodic expenses. Students interested must pick up outline in Kepner 201 by August 29. Prerequisite, BUS 220.

Salesmanship

BUS 261-902 3 hrs. credit (Class meets 8:20-4:05 MTWThF) August 15-19

An introductory course in the principles and practices of salesmanship. Attention is directed to selling to industrial and institutional purchasing agents, to distributors as well as retail level selling. Selling demonstrations are conducted and emphasis is placed on professional selling as a career.





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
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
